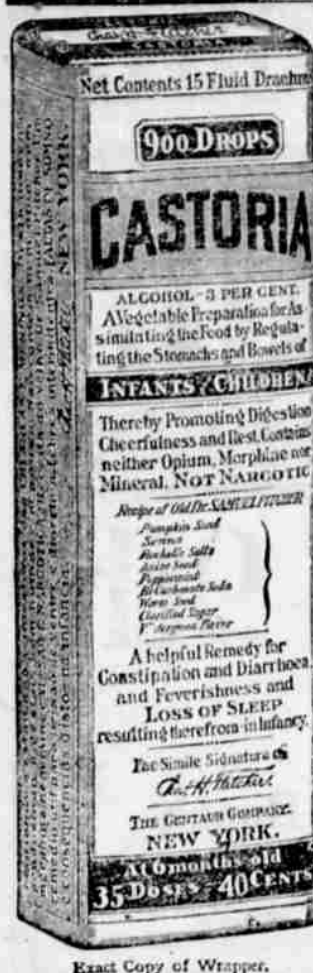

Some Stunt to Win 25 Games In Single Year

NEW YORK, April 5.—Tris Speaker, boss of the world's champion Indians, says he expects his "Big Three" twirlers Bagley, Mains and Covelski, to turn in from seventy-five to ninety games this season.

Johnny Elvers looks to Grover Alexander to win from 25 to 30 games. Miller Huggins is building pennant hopes for the New York Yankees on the ability of Bob Shawkey and Carl Mays to work around 750.

Winning twenty-five games through the course of a long season doesn't sound like such an accomplishment, but in thirty-seven years it has been done just one hundred times.

Jim Bagby, the big Cleveland ball hurler is the last on the list. He won thirty-one games last year and passed the thirty mark for the first time in three seasons.

Radbourne, pitching for the Providence National Club in 1884 was the first hurler to pass the thirty game mark. He won 57 games that season and lost twelve, for an average of .824.

Up until the nineties it was no unusual feat for a pitcher to win forty games, but at the same time they worked in many more games than the modern pitcher. The leading ball pitchers of the olden days hardly ever completed in less than 50 games and some of them went as high as 75. Since 1900, eighteen pitchers in the major leagues have turned in 30 games or better.

Jack Chesbro established the modern record for winning games when he pitched forty-one victories. Joe Wood made the best mark on record in 1912, when he won 34 games for the Boston Red Sox and lost five for an average of .871.

Farmers to Pass On New Marketing Plan

PORTLAND, April 5.—George A. Mansfield, president of the Oregon State Farm Bureau federation is on the way to Chicago as a member of the Oregon delegation to the conference called by president J. R. Howard, of the National Farm Bureau federation to work out the details of the grain marketing plans by the committee of seven.

From Chicago, Mansfield will go to Washington, D. C., as representative from the northwest to the special meeting of the National Farm Bureau federation which will work out a number of problems of interest to the farmers of the country. It is expected that at this meeting a legislative program will be mapped out to be pursued by the federation during the coming session of congress to improve the conditions now confronting the farmers.

Headquarters of the State Farm Bureau Federation have been established with the Oregon Dairy Council at 408 Morgan building. P. O. Powell, of Monmouth, secretary and treasurer of the farm bureau who is also vice-president of the Oregon Dairy Council, is in charge of the office during Mr. Mansfield's absence. The Oregon Dairy Council operates with the farm bureau in working out marketing problems of the dairy farmer.

different varieties of trees. This development varies under different conditions and is influenced by the character of fruit, soil, and location of the orchard, altitude, character of the soil and probably other conditions.

Because of the great variation of development in different parts of the county, it is impossible for me to state when each person should apply the different sprays. Each grower will have to determine just when the proper time comes to apply the different sprays in his particular orchard or on the different varieties in the orchard.

The spray that is now about due is the pink spray for apples. This spray is to assist in the control of the scale. It should be applied when the blossom buds are well separated and just before they are opened, or, just as the majority of the blossoms show the pink color. Use Lime-sulphur 1 to 40.

The next spray will be the calyx spray. It must be applied after the blooming period, just as the petals have about all fallen. This spray should be applied to both apples and pears. Use Lime-sulphur 1 to 40. For apples add Arsenate of Lead, one pound to 50 gallons of spray. Omit Arsenate of Lead for pears.

Drager Co. Ships Prunes to Germany

SALEM, April 6.—The largest deal in prunes of this season and the largest single shipment ever made from the northwest, has been concluded by W. F. Drager, of the Drager Fruit company of Salem, for export abroad. Approximately 1,450,000 pounds of Oregon, Washington and Italian prunes are being shipped to Germany, having been purchased within the past two weeks by the Drager Fruit company.

Of this quantity 1,025,000 pounds were purchased from the Oregon Growers Co-operative association, 300,000 pounds from the Washington Growers Co-operative association, and 125,000 pounds from the Dunce Prune Growers association.

The prunes have been sold to Germany and will be shipped during the present month by steamer from Portland, Or. The sizes represented in this sale are 70-80, 80-90, 90-100, and 100-120. While the prices for these prunes are low, it is practically a clean up of these sizes in the northwest.

TO PLANT 450,000 TREES.

Plans for the spring planting of burned over areas on national forests of Oregon and Washington have been completed, according to J. P. Kimmel, in charge of reforestation for the local forest service bureau. About 450,000 trees from the Wind River nursery will be planted in areas on the Rainier, Santiam and Crater national forests, the first in Washington and the other two being in this state.
