Flywheel Breaks Up a Sawmill

PORT MOODY, B. C., April 13.—A spinning flywheel, bursting without warning, completely wrecked the Thurston-Claville sawmill near here and did damage estimated at \$10,000.

The wheel was six feet in diameter and weighed ten tons. One fragment weighing 500 pounds flew out through the roof of the two story structure and imbedded itself in the timber 60 feet away. A half dozen men, working near the wheel, escaped without injury. The mill is to be rebuilt.
