U.S. May Call On Germany For C.C. Bergdoll

(News-Review Washington Bureau.)
 WASHINGTON, July 21.—When the United States and Germany evolve a treaty there may be a clause in that document which will mean that Grover Cleveland Bergdoll, rich deserter and draft evader, will have to stand trial on American soil for his crime. Steps are now being taken to insure in any treaty negotiated with Germany just such a provision.
Defiance of Law.
 As the house committee on the Bergdoll case gets deeper and deeper into the real facts of the defiance of the law of the United States by the Bergdoll family members of the committee are more and more determined that Grover Cleveland Bergdoll shall come back on to American soil and face a court martial and the proper punishment for his crimes.
 No case of desertion or defiance of the United States army has the same features that this case has and none showed such a determination to belittle the authorities of this country.

By all odds it is the most notorious case in the country growing out of the war and in some ways is internationally the cause celebre.
McArthur Has Plan.
 Congressman C. N. McArthur, one of the members of the sub-committee now inquiring into the various ramifications of the Bergdoll family, has reached a decision to place before President Harding and Secretary of State Hughes the desirability of the return of Bergdoll by the German government to the United States as one of the provisions of the first treaty to be made with Germany.
 He will present as justification for such action the notorious character of the case and the necessity for making an example of a rich deserter whose entire family conspired to escape the law requiring military service and which has in other ways defied and disgraced the authority of the federal government.

Douglas County Is Well Represented
 CORVALLIS, July 21.—Douglas county is represented in the summer session registration of 1012 at the college, by eight students. Thirty-two counties in Oregon are represented, sixteen other states, and six foreign countries. 869 students hail from points in Oregon.
 Registration includes 565 regular students; 221 club boys and girls, and 226 persons taking swimming only. Benton leads among counties, with 443, Multnomah coming second with 88.

Car Turns Turtle On Roberts Mt.
 The Chalmers car which turned turtle on Roberts Mountain yesterday was the property of Mr. and Mrs. Donaldson, and two children, who reside in California, and who were enroute to Roseburg to visit for a few days with their cousin Russell Harness of this city. They also expected to visit Portland and other northern points. The Donaldsons mistook the highway signs at Myrtle Creek, with the result that they took the old road out, coming over Roberts Mountain, the car meeting with the accident on this side. Mr. Donaldson, who was driving the car, is unable to explain exactly how the accident happened. None of the family were injured although all were pinned under the overturned car. Much damage was done to the automobile and the Donaldsons will remain in this city at the Russell Harness home until it is repaired.
