Club Members To Show Livestock

CORVALLIS, Aug. 19.—Awards and expense money totaling \$2100 will be distributed among boys and girls who take part in club exhibits and judging contests at the Pacific International Livestock exposition, November 6 to 13, in Portland. The premium list was prepared by O. M. Plummer, manager of the show.

The exposition management is providing the money to be divided into parts of \$1350 for award money, and \$750 for expense money for stock judging teams. Amounts of \$200 will be divided into prizes for each of the three leading dairy breeds—Jersey, Holstein and Guernsey, and a beef breed, \$100 for each of the four leading hog breeds—Poland China, Duroc Jersey, Berkshire and Chester White, and \$150 for sheep exhibits.

These contests and exhibits are open to club members from all states, who are enrolled in a club and who have carried on a project in accordance with club rules. No entrance fee will be charged and free pens for club members' animals will be furnished.

Traveling expenses up to \$500 will be prorated among teams taking part in the stock judging contest. Only one team from each county, to be chosen as the county club leader or county agent sees fit, will be allowed to take part. Rating in the contest will have no bearing on the amount received. Medals will be the awards. The team taking first will get the O. M. Plummer prize of a free trip to the junior summer session of the college. Sleeping quarters and meals will be provided for the teams.

Derrick Will Arrive Next Week

E. W. Cooper, manager of the Oakland Oil, Gas & Coal corporation, which company is superintending the drilling operations there, spent yesterday afternoon in this city. Mr. Cooper has received notification to the effect that the steel derrick ordered was shipped from Oklahoma on August 11, and will arrive here next week. NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE FOWLER STREET.

Notice is hereby given that at a meeting of the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, held on the 12th day of July, 1921, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, that the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, do hereby propose to improve Fowler Street from the north line of Court Street to the north line of 1st St., Block 7, Cradwick Addition to said city, in the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner:

First: By grading the street to the proper sub-grade.

Second: By paving the roadway of said street (two-four feet wide with concrete pavement).

Third: By constructing concrete curbs.

Fourth: By constructing sub-drains, if necessary.

Fifth: By constructing street monuments, if necessary.

Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe.

Seventh: By constructing catch-basins and inlets.

Said improvements are to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, and the grade, plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer, filed in the office of the City Recorder on the 15th day of July, 1921, which said grade, plans, specifications and estimates are hereby approved and adopted.

The entire cost of said improvement, including the cost of engineering, advertising, abstracting, clerical help and interest, shall be assessed upon the property especially benefited thereby, as provided by the Charter of the City of Roseburg, and in accordance with the petition of the property owners to be benefited by said improvement, and no part thereof shall be paid by the City of Roseburg.

The estimate of the City Engineer of the probable detailed cost of said improvement is the sum of \$2458.99. Resolved, that the City Recorder of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, be and is is hereby directed to give notice of said proposed improvement as provided by the Charter of the City of Roseburg.

Remonstrances against said proposed improvement may be filed with the undersigned within twenty days from the first publication of this notice which is August 16, 1921.

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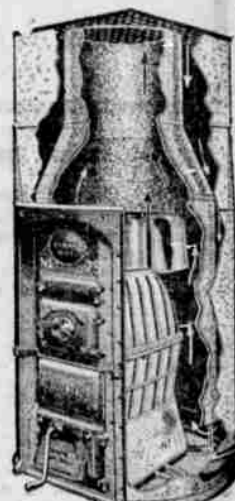
