Prune Packing Is Being Pushed

In an effort to fill the early orders for prunes as soon as possible, the Oregon Growers Co-operative association is packing in all of the prune growing districts.

The plants at Salem, Dallas, Riddle, Myrtle Creek, Yamhill and Creswell are working at top speed in an effort to get at least 15 carloads this week. The first shipments have already been made and 12 carloads have rolled up to this time. Eight of these cars are for export to England and Canada.

Due to the car shortage caused by the heavy movement of fruit from the Pacific coast at this time, it is probable that shipments may be retarded considerably and the association is at present laboring under the difficulty of securing cars as fast as they are needed.

Italian Annual Deficit Reduced

ROME, Oct. 19.—The efforts of the Italian government to reduce its annual deficit are bearing fruit as is evidenced by the recent report made the Finance Ministry.

According to the report, the Italian tax receipts for April, the last month for which all statistics have been compiled, were greater by 1,200,000,000 lire (about \$48,000,000) than they were in the corresponding month before the war. The pre-war receipts amounted to 254,000,000. The receipts for the past April amounted to 1,451,000,000 lire.

This means a per capita rate of about 15 lire (about \$1.60) per year.

American Jazz Hits Mexico City

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 19.—American "jazz devils" have come to Mexico City and have made their symphony popular but their theatre-going Mexicans have failed to appreciate an American musical comedy as recently presented by a company of "girly-girls" direct from Broadway, to use the words of the inspired press agent. The company appeared here as one of the attractions of the Centennial celebration. Advertised as a hit of Broadway transplanted to Mexico, they were intended to add a bit of pepper and zest to the month of fiestas, but after a few nights, interest lagged and the show concluded its run without breaking any attendance records.

It was not because the attraction was below the standard of any similar show in the United States. Old-timers in the American colony here musical comedy will not pay in Mexico and their predictions appear to have been substantiated in the recent attempt.

New Position at Courthouse

A new position was created at the court house today when Miss Winifred Blagg of this city was appointed Assistant Clerk in the County Roadmaster's office. Until the present time, the Roadmaster's books have been cared for by Miss Harriet Waldeman, who is also clerk for the county court. Miss Waldeman will supervise the roadmaster's books in the future as the county court records and books are so closely connected with those of the roadmaster that one person must have knowledge of both. The clerical work, however, will be done by Miss Blagg, under the supervision of Miss Waldeman. The new position carries a salary of \$180 per month.

TRUCKS TO CARRY MAILSDURINGSTRIKE

Postmaster Expects Orders From Washington to Form Emergency Truck Service.

FREIGHT LINES FORMED

Information From Portland and San Francisco is to the Effect That Huge Truck Lines Are Being Formed to Handle Freight.

That the mails will continue to go out and be received at regular intervals, in spite of a nationwide railroad strike, is the statement of Postmaster L. F. Reizenstein, who is daily expecting the receipt of orders to inaugurate an emergency truck service to handle mails between the cities of the county. It is quite probable that even in the event of a strike, the railroad companies will be able to keep sufficient trains running to carry mails, but the government it is expected, will provide for any emergencies which may arise and will instruct the postmasters in the larger cities to arrange for truck service.

It is understood that truck companies in Portland and San Francisco are already arranging for a huge truck line to handle freight from all points between these two cities. In the event of a strike the trucks will start operation at once and will prevent any large congestion of freight. The fact that the Pacific highway is paved throughout practically its entire length will enable these trucks to operate for several months, should train traffic be held up that long.

Passenger stage lines would probably be called upon in the event of emergencies, to handle the mails and light express or freight. As these passenger lines are already firmly established in practically all localities, emergency rules could be quickly adopted for the handling of government mails and no delay need be experienced.

It is evident that people all over the country are depending upon the automobiles and auto trucks in the event of a general tie-up of the railroads. In former years serious strike threats resulted at once in a disorganization of business, frenzied buying of supplies and a general hoarding provisions. It is now realized, however, that the nationwide network of improved highways, coupled with the many millions of motor vehicles in commercial use, will result in an organized movement of provisions, mails, etc., so that no great hardships will be felt as in years when these carriers did not exist.

Rand Appointed to Supreme Bench

SALEM, Or., Oct. 19.—John L. Rand, prominent attorney of Baker, tonight was appointed by Governor Olcott as associate justice of the Oregon supreme court to succeed Justice Henry L. Benson, who died here early last Sunday. It was said here tonight that Mr. Rand will accept the appointment.

Mr. Rand was born October 28, 1861, at Portsmouth, N. H. He was educated in the public schools there and at Smith's preparatory school, also of Portsmouth. He also is a graduate of Dartmouth college, from which institution he graduated in 1882, receiving the degree of A. B.

Attorney Rand was admitted to the bar at Walla Walla, Wash., in May, 1885. He came to Oregon in July of that year and in May, 1886, was admitted to the bar in this state where he has been in active practice ever since at Baker.

He was elected district attorney of the sixth judicial district in 1888 and 1894 and was elected state senator from Baker, Malheur and Harney counties in 1902. Mr. Rand has been highly successful as a prosecuting attorney and prominent as a citizen. He is a member of the board of higher curricula, to which place he was appointed by Governor Olcott.

By the appointment of Mr. Rand the supreme court will retain two members from eastern Oregon. Justice Benson, at the time of his election to the supreme bench, was a resident of Klamath Falls, which is in the eastern Oregon district.
