ath county is not large enough for the successful publication of two daily newspapers.

"2. The plant and equipment of the Klamath Record Publishing company is much inferior to that of the Herald Publishing company. To successfully continue in business the Klamath Record would have to purchase machinery to an amount not less than \$10,000.

"3. In view of the fact that the business men of the community are already somewhat strained and are compelled to cut overhead wherever possible, two strongly competitive papers only complicated the situation. The revenue of a newspaper is largely dependent upon the display advertising of local merchants."

It will be noted that the first and principal reason given by the Record for suspending was that Klamath Falls is not large enough to support two daily papers, and yet Klamath Falls is much larger than Marshfield. The fact is, the business men were weary of the economic loss of supporting two daily papers in a field fully covered by one. The same conditions and the same situations produced the same result in Marshfield. There is neither room, business or occasion for two daily papers except to gratify peevish politicians or personal prejudices and these are far from business reasons—Coos Bay Times.

JUGGLING TAXES.

There is great trouble in Washington over the tax bill. There is trouble because some of the leaders are attempting to find a way in which taxes can be removed from the man or corporation of large means and placed on the man of small means without permitting the man of small means to know it. To date, the way has not been found.

The reason there is effort to put the taxes on the masses is because taxes have to be collected from somebody. If unemployment is to be overcome and normal conditions restored it is necessary that capital that has been withdrawn from productive enterprises be returned thereto. It is the theory of those in power at Washington that the way to get capital back to work is to remove the taxes on capital and permit large profits to accrue without interference by the government. Then, the theory follows, capital will go back to work, unemployment will disappear and the United States will be back to normal.—Oregon Journal.

SOIL ANALYSIS NOT FEASIBLE

Samples of Oregon soils taken according to directions will be examined and if possible identified as to type, but it is not feasible to make complete analysis of the many samples taken irregularly and sent to the state college experiment station. Soil surveys are being made as rapidly as possible including physical and chemical analysis of the various types, which are tested for fertilizer needs and methods of management. It is thus impossible to analyze the many miscellaneous samples sent in. They will be given simple tests for acidity, alkali or organic matter where desirable. The soils department will be glad to learn of any soil troubles, and will send free directions for taking and sending soil samples.

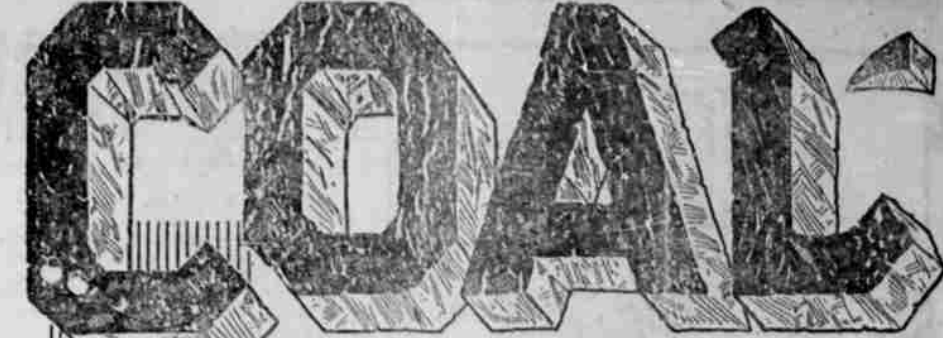

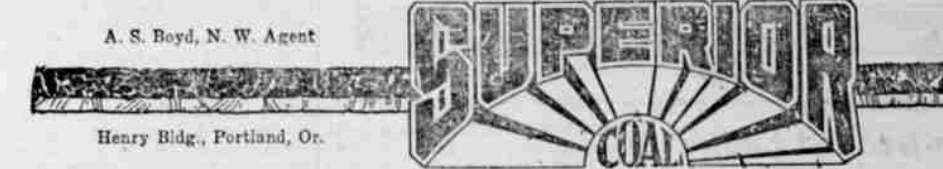
