

SHEEP GRAZING CAUSES ARGUMENT

Noted Author Contends That
Cascades Should be Set
Aside For Amusement
Not Commercialism.

STATEMENTS ANSWERED

Well Known Stock Raiser Claims
That Author is Mistaken in
Statement, and That Sheep
Are Benefit to Range.

Stockmen have been greatly aroused over an article recently written by Walter Pritchard Eaton, prominent eastern author, who following a trip into the Cascade mountains has advocated the prohibition of stock grazing in the Cascades. Mr. Eaton claims that the sheep kill the wild flowers and thus destroy one of the great attractions. He also protests the practice of allowing sheep and cattle to use the trails leading into the various scenic spots. He states that there are millions of acres of idle land in the United States, particularly in his own state of Massachusetts, where sheep could be grazed to much better advantage than in the Cascade mountains, and states that it is a national problem and not a local matter, the majority of the people of the country demanding that the thin edge of the frontier now existing be maintained for the "refreshment" of the entire nation.

Forest Supervisor Ramsdell is in receipt of the following letter from Fred W. Falconer, of Pendleton, one of the leading stock raisers of the state, in which he answers Mr. Eaton's contentions:

Mr. Walter Pritchard Eaton's article in the Telegram, issue October 8, 1921, relative to sheep grazing in the Cascades, has been brought to my attention.

The sentiments expressed in that article are those commonly held by many easterners but hardly ever held by one so widely traveled and so well informed as Mr. Eaton.

His first contention that sheep permanently destroy the wild flowers which grow in abundance in the Cascades is, I believe, one that cannot be proven. I have grazed sheep in the Oregon mountains for over twenty years and, where this grazing is properly done, the native flowers are now as vigorous and abundant as when I first began to use the mountains for grazing purposes. I am willing to concede that overgrazing will destroy the grasses and other vegetation and I agree with Mr. Eaton that sheep will eat most every kind of weed and wild flower, but in the forest reserve where I have occasion to graze sheep, enough of the native grasses and flowers go to seed

every year to more than replenish the next year's growth.

Mr. Eaton's intimation that cattle are not nearly as destructive to wild flowers as sheep proves that he has had no practical experience with either on the Oregon ranges, as cattle, where the range is overgrazed, will and do eat nearly any and nearly all kinds of grasses, weeds and flowers. No doubt Mr. Eaton has seen some of the desolate fire swept areas in our mountains. One band of sheep will do more as a preventative to keep down forest fires than is possible for ten men to do where grazing is prohibited.

Mr. Eaton's theory that it would be better to buy wool and mutton from Argentina than to destroy the wild flowers in our mountains, sounds more like the theory of the citizen of the world than of a red blooded American. I, too, am a lover of nature in the wild, but not at the expense of one of our great industries. Scenery and wild flowers are very beautiful but would not clothe and feed our soldiers in the case of another great world war. Neither will they bring prosperity and happiness to as many people as will the production of meat and wool.

Mr. Eaton's contention that there are millions upon millions of acres of waste land in the United States now idle, that are better adapted to sheep grazing than the Cascades, either proves that the people living in those sections of the United States lack initiative and ambition because of not having stocked these lands, or that Mr. Eaton is mistaken. If Massachusetts has three million acres of waste land, one acre of which will support more sheep than twenty acres in the Cascades, and which state probably has the best wool manufacturing plants of any state in the Union, and which had in 1919 only 28,000 sheep against Oregon's two and one-half million, then there is a decided lack of ambition and foresight in that state and its citizens are overlooking one of its best bets. Mr. Eaton would evidently like to have the people in Massachusetts raise all the sheep and all the wool and make all the money and have the Oregonians keep up, at our expense, the beauty spots in the Cascades where the people of Massachusetts might come to rest from the arduous toil of raising wool and mutton to feed and clothe the people of the United States and, incidentally, the people of the Pacific northwest. This theory puts me in mind of a farmer who was in favor of putting his neighbor's farm into a game preserve so that he, after he had harvested bountiful crops on his own land, might find needed recreation on his neighbor's farm hunting and shooting the game that was raised at his neighbor's expense.

As there are about eight lbs. of grease wool in a suit of clothes, it would cost Mr. Eaton exactly 12.5 cents for the freight on the Oregon wool in his suit of clothes bought in Massachusetts. As for the freight back on a suit of clothes for the Oregon consumer, we hereby inform Mr. Eaton and the world at large, that we are now manufacturing in Oregon woolen goods from pure virgin wool produced in Oregon and that we have natural conditions and advantages in this state which will

some time, make us the leading wool manufacturing state in the Union.
