They were in the immigration of 1850, coming from Missouri. Miss Staley was a child of seven years when she came with her mother and her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Staley across the plains in 1864 from the state of Iowa. The assembled guests who partook of the wedding feast held on Sunday in commemoration of the event of a half century before were mainly of the family relatives from far and near, and the dinner was not only delicious, but most tastefully arranged. The greetings to the venerable and happy couple, throughout the day, from kinsmen, neighbors and numerous old time friends were most cordial, with a feeling message of happy thought from Honorable Blinger Hermann, of Roseburg, who had been Mr. Ambrose's teacher in the childhood days, many years ago at the old Yoncalla "Institute." The interior of the home residence was appropriately decorated and many beautiful and useful presents evidenced the good wishes of those there. Of this marital union of 50 years

there has been six children, fourteen grandchildren and three great grandchildren. The six immediate children are as follows: Amy Colwell of Chico, Calif.; C. G. Ambrose of Kansas City, Mo.; James M. Ambrose, Jr., of Cottage Grove; Alma C. Harness and Elma Capps, of Roseburg; and G. C. Ambrose of Yoncalla. Most of these were at the old home to do honor to their revered father and mother.
