Oregon Football Classic is Tie

EUGENE, Ore., Nov. 21.—In a game in which the University of Oregon and the Oregon Agricultural college, ancient rivals in their annual contest, they, Saturday, struggled through four periods without a score. This was the sixth tie between the teams in the 25 games they have played.

With mud plastered all over them and in their eyes the players had to stop again and again. The contest resolved itself in the last period into a punting duel between Leslie of the Oregon team and Gill of the Fighting Aggies, both making numerous splendid kicks.

It was a see-saw battle, the ball, however, being most of the time in Oregon's territory after the first period. The slippery condition of the ball caused numerous fumbles, two at critical periods.

O. A. C.'s hopes were high just before the close, when Gill punted fifty yards to Oregon's ten-yard line, but the Aggies failed to score and Leslie punted fifty yards from the danger zone. Chapman, King and Johnson of the Oregon team used battering ram tactics for good gains in the early part of the game.

PORTLAND, Nov. 21.—Oregon today appeared to be emerging from a terrific sleet and snow storm, as the temperature slowly rises. The rain is continuing here, with meager reports of slightly easier conditions in the eastern part of the state. Trains vast over the Spokane, Portland and Seattle lines and the Union Pacific are held snowbound with traffic diverted by way of Tacoma. The river boats last night brought in a few score of stormbound passengers, picking them up along the river banks from the stranded trains and automobiles. The wires are down into eastern Oregon but it is understood that many towns are suffering from heavy snowfalls. Much stock is feared lost on the range.
