Building Will Be Repaired

Owing to the failure of the city attorney to draft the ordinance requested by the board of fire commissioners relative to the repair of wooden buildings damaged by fire within the business district, the commissioners were forced to grant the request of H. Marks to repair the buildings directly north of the Liberty theater, which were damaged by fire a few days ago. At the former fire in these buildings the commissioners endeavored to force demolition of the structures, but because of a weakness in the ordinance the owner succeeded in having them repaired. The commissioners then requested a new ordinance, but up to the present time it has not been drafted and presented to the council and consequently the commissioners must be guided by the old regulations.

These provide that a building may be repaired unless damaged 40 percent or more. Contractors who have investigated the buildings where the fire occurred stated that the damage amounted to 32 or 35 percent and consequently the commissioners have no alternative but to allow repairs to be made.
