Reedsport Ready to Aid Road Work

That the Reedsport Chamber of Commerce is behind the Douglas county court, is evidenced by a letter received this morning. The letter says:

"The Reedsport Chamber of Commerce desires to compliment the county court of Douglas county for the energetic manner in which it is prosecuting the building of the Umpqua highway. We feel that much good work has been done and that the county court deserves great credit.

"As you well know there is at this time a great opportunity to procure additional aid for the road through the forestry department of the federal government. I would like to bring to the attention of the court the urgent need of prompt action in applying for such aid, for it appears that those applying first will be supplied first. The Reedsport Chamber of Commerce wishes to aid in every

possible way to secure such assistance from the government, and I am writing to ask you to use us in any manner that you can. We realize that any request for this aid must come from the court and through the proper channels. We do not wish in any way to do anything that would, through ignorance of methods, hamper your work, and yet we want you to know that we are ready to carry out any suggestion you may make. In other words, we want to aid and co-operate with the county court in this matter.

"We are ready to take any action that you may suggest as being wise, and assure you that we will take any action that you deem wise.

"Other communities are asking for this aid, and for roads that touch our district. We, however, feel that this our most important road, and to the support of which we are pledged first.
