Umpqua Valley Apples Praised

With the last large shipment of apples from the Willamette and Umpqua valleys on its way to England in the holds of the steamship Nebraska, the apple shipping season in these districts is completed. The Nebraska is carrying the largest single lot which the Oregon Growers' association shipped during the season.

The Willamette valley apple crop received a severe setback in the early blooming period this year, when the cold and rainy weather prevented pollination and caused the blossoms to drop. As a result the yield was far below normal and it is probable that the total shipments from the valley will not pass 175 cars. The association handled 131 cars of apples in the valley, an estimated 75 per cent of the crop.

Association shipments in the Umpqua valley numbered 111 cars. A normal crop was harvested in this district. Eastern buyers receiving this fruit were very loud in their praise of its excellent quality.

In spite of the general sluggish condition of the market throughout the shipping season there was a good demand for large apples of nearly every variety if they could be laid on the market early. On the other hand, small apples are hard to dispose of even in a year when the demand is good.
