SUPREME COURT DISPOSES OF 251 CASES IN 1921

SALEM, Jan. 3.—A summary of the activities of the Oregon supreme court for the past year, compiled by Arthur S. Benson, clerk of the court shows that a total of 251 cases were disposed of during the year as compared with a total of 248 cases filed, a gain of three in favor of the court.

There are now 110 appeals pending before the court ready for argument. Fifty-eight attorneys were admitted to practice in Oregon during the year, 43 on examination and 15 on certificates from other states.

Receipts of the department for the year aggregated \$9961.64, of which \$1480 was received from attorneys admitted to practice and \$7871.84 from general filing fees.

WRESTLERS MEET TOMORROW

PORTLAND, Jan. 3.—(United Press.)—Ben Reuben, who lost his recent bout here with Walter Miller of Los Angeles has finally clinched a match with Ted Thye, Multnomah club instructor.

Miller and Thye both claim the professional middleweight championship in wrestling circles and Reuben seems to be the goat to determine who really is champion.

Reuben countered by staying for two hours with Walter Miller, neither of them getting a fall, but Miller securing the bout on aggressiveness and general mat ability.
