Pine Beetles and White Rust Terrors

PORTLAND, Jan. 12.—(United Press.)—Pine beetles and white pine rust have become the same terror to the northwest lumber men and government forestry department workers as the hordes of boll weevil and boll worm have become to cotton planters of the south.

Pine beetles and white pine rust are destroying hundreds of thousands of feet of yellow pine and other timber annually. Beetles alone claimed 1,500,000,000 feet of white pine timber in the last ten years, according to a report made to the forestry service by A. J. Joenicks, of that department.

Most of the beetle infested timber is in Klamath and Lake counties in southern Oregon. The white pine rust started in British Columbia and is working rapidly south each year.

Private timber owners have organized to combat the menace, but government timber is involved too, and U. S. help is being sought.

U. of O. Lantern Slides Are Used

EUGENE, Jan. 12.—In Douglas county extensive use is being made of the educational slides and films loaned free by the University of Oregon.

The schools at Ash, Camas Valley, Drain, Elkton, Oakland, Riddle, Sutherlin and Roseburg have all used slides during the past year. Mr. John Miller had a special showing for Boy Scouts. Both films and slides have been used by Mr. Fred Goff and by the schools at Wilbur and Yoncalla. Mr. A. E. Street, former county club leader, showed widely over the county a set on Oregon industry and scenery. Miss Caroline Wallace, county nurse, used the health film, "Come Clean," on the hygiene of good teeth.
