

WOMEN CHOSEN FOR JURY DUTY

Circuit Court Jury List Made
Up and Names Women
Are Selected.

NEW LAW IS FOLLOWED

Women Drawn for Jury Duty Have
the Right of Refusal and Service
Is Not Made Compulsory—
Size of List is Increased.

For the first time in the history of Douglas county, women have been drawn for the Circuit Court jury. Following out the new law, approved by the voters of the state at the last special election, the county court has selected three hundred and thirty jurors, of which number ninety-two are women.

Women chosen for jury duty have the right of refusing to serve and whenever they are summoned for this service they will find attached to the summons a blank upon which they may decline to fill the place for which they are called. In the event of such refusal new jurors must be drawn as service on the part of women is not made compulsory. All of the women drawn give their occupation as housewife, while the men chosen are mostly farmers although some of other occupations are included. BORDEAUX SPRAY FOR PEACH LEAF CURD

Peach leaf curd is one of the two serious diseases that infects the trees in this county. This fungus disease, while very injurious, and often destructive, can be readily controlled by spraying with bordeaux. Just two things are necessary for successful control. First, a thorough application of bordeaux properly made. Second, make the application at the right time.

Make the bordeaux according to the regular formula, 6-6-60 strength. If any one does not know how to make, apply to the county fruit inspector for information.

This spray should be applied during this month (January) or not later than the first few days of February.

Any twig or bud that is not covered with the spray, has no protection and will likely become diseased.
