**Small Pox Warning  
Is Issued Today**

Great care should be taken in reporting small pox cases and observing quarantine. City Health Officer B. R. Shoemaker stated this afternoon. At the present time there are five cases of smallpox under quarantine and there is a great danger of further spread unless precautions are taken. Smallpox is sweeping the east and middle west and is appearing in a malignant form in some sections causing many deaths. On the Pacific coast it is beginning to show up in epidemic form but is not yet severe. It is the history of such epidemics, however, that as they progress they become more and more serious and consequently early precautions should be taken. Recently a case was not reported to the city health officer and from this case the five now quarantined are known to have come. There is a severe penalty provided for failure to report contagious diseases and also a penalty for breaking quarantine. In some cases it is claimed the parents in families, where smallpox has occurred have not even called in a physician and have observed none of the rules of quarantine. Such cases result in endangering the lives of others and if families do not report neighbors should do so for the protection of others. It is hoped that the disease may be checked before it reaches epidemic form for it is feared that it could become general its severity

is apt to cause death in some cases. There are a few light cases of influenza reported also but these are not serious, Dr. Shoemaker reports.

**Whisky-Laden Diver  
Reported Sighted**

ABERDEEN, Wash., Jan. 17.—A 95-foot submarine, rumored to have carried a cargo of liquor and to have been the flagship of a fleet of three similar craft, landed at low tide Saturday afternoon in the mouth of the Quinault river at Point Grenville, about six miles north of Moclips, according to word brought to Grays Harbor today.

Remaining in the craft until nightfall, members of the crew are said to have gone ashore for water just prior to high tide, when the ship floated again and disappeared. Indians on their way from Tahola to Moclips were the first to notice the craft. Almost completely submerged, and with only a periscope, which they thought was a mast, visible in addition to a section of the hull, the object to them appeared to be a wrecked schooner with masts showing above water. Acting on this belief the Indians spent the afternoon attempting to get lines on the ship, but were unsuccessful on account of the rising tide and breakers. Throughout the afternoon, it was said, there were no signs of life from within the ship, and only at dusk when the men came ashore, were the Indians apprised that the craft was a submarine. The ship apparently had no trouble retreating from the mouth of the river, the landing having been made at a point where at high water there would be plenty of room for operation. A member of the crew is said to have told those ashore that there were two additional submarines, loaded with whiskey, waiting a short distance out.
