Price on Large Prunes Advanced

An advance of half a cent a pound on 30-40 prunes is announced by the Oregon Growers Co-operative association. The association's advisory committee of prune growers fixed the new price of 12 3/4 cents a pound on prunes packed in 25 pound boxes.

This increase follows up the advance which was named on all of the other sizes of prunes by the association last week, ranging from 2 cents on 25-30s down to 3-4 of a cent on the smallest Petites.

Considerable activity on the part of buyers was shown just preceding the price advance and the association has disposed of three quarters of a million pounds of prunes in the period following the opening of the new year.

Scarcely in nearly all lines of dried and canned fruits makes it apparent that the new price is warranted and it is expected that the trade will take hold of offerings at the new prices. Jobbers' supplies of prunes are reported to be very light at the present time and retailers' shelves are in constant need of replenishment. In view of these conditions the prune men are inclined to believe that the present situation is the most encouraging one which has developed during the entire season.

buying active and reasonable. Nearly all plants, except seasonal, running full capacity with some overtime. Retail trade, considering the present state of industry, is reported good.

Portland—A large number of residences under construction; few for rent. Buying active. Several factory buildings, railroad improvements, new dam and pipe line, highway and extensive dock work, will give employment to several thousand resident family men. Repairs, made necessary through storm damage, are requiring several thousand workmen. Unemployment not increasing and considered about normal for the season. Plants closed are a lumber mill, small metal plants, affecting about 200 men. Shipyards closed since war. The logging camps and sawmills are increasing output. Business reported good in this basic industry. Textiles, leather, paper, chemicals, stone, clay, glass, railroad and ship repair, rapidly approaching. If not nearly normal. Woolen mills employ female help in considerable numbers.

Astoria—All seasonal activities at an end. Several new homes under construction. No acute housing situation. A strong demand for new homes at reasonable prices. Construction of one new sawmill and rebuilding of another under way. Will employ about 200 men. Lumber is the basic industry. One large mill running two shifts, and the other operating normally. Demand for experienced loggers.

GELLATLEY IS PARDONED

CORVALLIS, Jan. 19.—(Special.)—Ex-Sheriff Gellatley, convicted two years ago of misappropriating Benton county funds, has received a pardon, restoring him to full citizenship. Mr. Gellatley was sentenced to the penitentiary and paroled to his brother. He has always been considered an exemplary citizen and his misuse of public money was generally attributed to carelessness and lack of understanding rather than to criminal intent.
