VALUABLE LOOKOUT STATION APPROVED

Permanent Quarters to Be
Constructed on Extreme
Summit of Mt. Bailey.

PLANS ARE RECEIVED

Standard Forest Service Lookout
House to be Built During Com-
ing Summer—Two Forests
Will be Benefited.

Forest Supervisor Ramsdell states that plans have been completed for the construction of a permanent lookout on the summit of Mount Bailey, one of the highest peaks of the Cascades and that the structure will be erected as soon as weather conditions will permit active work to start. The lookout will be located on the highest point on the mountain which has an elevation of 8356 feet. From this point the observer will be able to see practically all of the Diamond Lake country in the Umpqua forest and will be able to detect fires in the northern part of the Crater Lake national park and the Crater forest. The lookout will be one of the most valuable in the state and will have an unobstructed view in every direction.

During the past few years the peak has been used as a temporary lookout, an observer camping on one of the lower slopes and making a trip each day to the summit. Last year the forest service completed a telephone line to the top of the mountain and the station was instrumental in detecting a number of fires before they could do any damage.

The lookout will be one of the forest service standard lookout houses. These houses come ready cut, and are shipped in knocked-down form. No piece is longer than four feet and all sections are tied in bundles which weigh not more than forty pounds. The lookouts are nearly always packed to the point where they are to be erected either on the backs of horses or men and consequently the size and weight must be kept as low as possible.

They are of a necessity built of the best material obtainable. They are constructed of wood entirely, very little metal being used in order to reduce danger from lightning. They are 12x12 feet in size with a 6x6 foot cupola tower which is glass enclosed. All parts of the building are reinforced and all joints are overlapping. The materials are heavily painted and certain parts are crocoted. A special system of joints gives extra strength.

All four corners are guyed down by heavy cables anchored to one inch iron bolts set in solid rock and turnbuckles are provided so that they may always be kept tight. The entire building is protected from lightning by a "bird cage" system of lightning rods.

Being built on the most exposed slopes the structures must be designed to withstand the most terrific winds and must also be moisture proof, as the storms driven by heavy winds would force snow into the buildings should there be the smallest crack. All windows are provided with extra heavy shutters which are kept closed during the fall and winter weather.

The Mount Bailey station will be constructed as soon as weather conditions will permit and will be used during the coming summer in guarding the forests from fires.

Chamber Commerce Dinner Big Success

That the success of it has been immense. Plural memberships in the chamber were advocated and he stated that the membership of the Salem chamber of commerce is over 800 as a result of this plan. He deplored the methods of the old-time commercial clubs in publishing four-colored literature of fence corner pumpkins and also of sending such pamphlets to the easterners and inducing them to come west with \$500 when they should have had \$1500.

"After you fooled those people and got them out here they naturally would start knocking for things were not just as you had pictured them," he said. "Then you would tell them to move on or quit knocking. Those people bought their hammer and paid dearly for it. That's just the reason they had a right to use it. The trouble with us in the past is that we've built a cupola and hung out a monster flag but we've had no foundation on which to place the cupola. We had a flag and were so anxious to exhibit it that we forgot about the foundation. Let's build a good foundation."

He stated that the agricultural communities make the town and he "roasted" the "city fellows" who think they are just a little better than their "country cousins."

"If the country community is building us up, then we must help build up the country community," he said. "We have no license to go out in the rural districts and ask the farmers to join our chamber of commerce unless that farmer gets some benefit from the organization. Every little community has a right to a club and they should have delegates meet once a month with the chamber organization to perfect plans for building the county. We've got
