He was appointed temporarily until the meeting of the council at which time the appointment was ratified and made permanent.

JEWISH FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS

Has Been Held for Centuries as a Memorial of the Dedication of the Altar.

Hanukkah, the Feast of Dedication also called "Feast of the Macabees," is a Jewish festival beginning on the twenty-fifth day of Kislev (December) and continuing for eight days, chiefly as a festival of lights. It was instituted by Judas Maccabeus his brothers and the elders of the congregation of Israel, in the year 165 B. C., to be celebrated annually with mirth and joy as a memorial of the dedication of the altar, or the purification of the sanctuary.

After having recovered the Holy city and the Temple from the Greeks, Judas ordered a new altar to be built in the place of the one which had been polluted by Antiochus Epiphanes, who had caused a pagan altar to be set up in the Temple of Jerusalem, and sacrifices to be offered to his idol. When the fire had been kindled anew upon the altar and the lamps of the candlestick lit, the dedication of the altar was celebrated for eight days and sacrifices and songs.

In the Talmud the festival is principally known as the "Feast of Illumination," and it was usual either to display eight lamps on the first night of the festival, and reduce the number on each successive night, or to begin with one lamp the first night, increasing the number till the eighth night. The lights are supposed to be symbolical of the liberty obtained by the Jews on the day of which Hanukkah is the celebration.

**In Nude
Causing Furore**
YORK, Feb. 7. (U. P.)—A woman threw a "natural" nude picture and got away with it, it is said.
There is nothing intrinsically about a painting of a nude woman that artists admit, but the nudity of a young blonde woman contending, wearing a costume beneath her right arm, causing dreadful agitation among conservative National Guard members, was the subject of Wednesday whether caused by the famous artist, who is to be taken down to a better position, giving light as just taken down, making portrayals a young girl from the waist except to show over one shoulder, and by odd coincidence, the artist by anonymous complaints was filled with the board of governors.
To determine just for themselves where refinement in nudity ceases and where immorality starts, a score of women from the Pen and Bndish club rushed over to the Arts club to view Bellows' work. Many unkind comments are reported.
