CANNED FOOD WEEK OBSERVED

Campaign to Educate Public In Use of Canned Food Products Started.

PACK IS ENORMOUS

Three Million Cases of Canned Foods Produced in the Northwest and Money Distributed Largely to Growers and Labor.

The period from March 1 to March 8 is being nationally observed as Canned Foods Week, during which time canned food products are being brought before the people of the country in an attractive manner, while at the same time educational information is being given to stimulate the use of canned food products in the homes. Regarding the campaign and its purposes, Frank J. Norton, the local cannerman, says: "The object of Canned Foods Week is to acquaint the housewife with the good qualities, the wide variety, and the cheapness of the different canned food products. "Canned foods are one of the great benefits of civilization—one of those few far reaching triumphs of modern inventive genius which minister daily to the wants and comfort of all the people. Canned foods have raised the standard of living, made good food a reality in practically every home and vastly increased the pleasure of the dining table. Canned foods have bettered the health of the people and lessened their labor. Canned foods are among the outstanding achievements of modern times. "The National Canners' association keep a large corps of men, nationally known, in research work, so that canned foods may be kept safe and to evolve many of the problems which come in the process of manufacturing. "Notwithstanding the seemingly large production of canned foods today, the consumption per capita is not large. It can be increased many per cent, and canned foods week is a concentrated effort on the part of the industry to get the public thinking along canned foods line, to let them know that the canning of foods has ceased to be a haphazard business, but has evolved into a science directed by experts; that the housewife can place on her table commercially canned foods more cheaply than she could the product of her own efforts, and every bit as wholesome; also to call attention to the many varieties of fruits preserved in tin, which are available for the table 12 months of the year. All of the canners organizations are adopting plans to standardize all packs of canned foods, so that the pack will be more uniform. "The pack of the northwest this year, amounted to nearly three million cases, bringing into this territory a large sum of money which is distributed largely to the grower, labor, and the box factories. "The growth of the canning business in the northwest is just beginning and with the quality being produced will develop in a continuous growth."
