Youngest Girl Preacher Has No Use For Modern Flappers

MIAMI, Okla., March 5.—A slinky world calls her the "flapper preacher," but she is not that at all. Just a slip of a girl, Miss Orietta Stoddard, still in grade school, but already an ordained minister of the gospel. The district conference of the Methodist Episcopal church in recent session at Tulsa admitted her to the ministry and thereby made her the youngest ordained preacher in the United States. She was voted in by acclamation, after having passed every test successfully.

Miss Stoddard has no use for the butterfly life of the modern "flapper" just in her teens. Jazz music's most syncopated moans and whines fail to entice her, for she has given up all social activities, including dancing.

"Cake-eaters in flaring bell-bottom trousers, a fashion epidemic now raging in Oklahoma, fail to amuse her, although she is one of the most popular girls in school.

"My work is more important than silly love affairs," she said. "I have been called by my God and I intend to make the ministry my life's work."

Makes Pulpit Debut.
Miss Stoddard made her pulpit debut in her home town, Miami, where she now is in the seventh grade at school. She first attracted widespread attention as a preacher of the gospel, however, when she delivered a sermon to the congregation of the First Methodist church at Baxter Springs, Kansas, at an evening service. The Rev. O. B. Morris, district superintendent, declared she led more young people to the gospel on that occasion than had the regular minister during any previous meeting.

Two years ago the girl preacher, after joining the church, first began her religious work. Under the direction of her pastor, the Rev. G. A. Kleinfelder, of Miami, she prepared her first sermon, which was delivered from the Rev. Kleinfelder's pulpit. She later preached regularly at the old folks' home at Miami and then filled a temporary vacancy at Picher, Okla., for two services.

Miss Stoddard plans to complete her high school education at Miami and will attend the Oklahoma City Methodist college to finish her gospel training. During the approaching school vacation, however, she will be assigned to regular preaching throughout the district, according to Mr. Morris.

Ashland Wins on Own Floor

MEDFORD, March 6.—The Medford high school five was defeated Friday night at Ashland on the Ashland high school gym floor by the Ashland quintet by a score of 45-18. Most of the Medford boys played a hard game, fighting from start to finish. The Medford basketballing was both inaccurate and unlucky, and but for the defense and the good work of the guards the score would have gone much higher.

The Ashland team had the advantage of the floor and it seemed that no matter from what position the ball was thrown, with one hand or two, it fell through the basket. A number of one-handed baskets were made by the Ashland men and several times the ball was merely batted into the air and fell through the hoop.

Few teams have defeated Ashland on the home floor in the memory of many basketball fans. Even when Medford had the best team in the state some five or six years ago that team was defeated on the Ashland floor. Ashland supporters themselves honestly admit that the floor is a decided advantage to the Red and White quintet.

The Medford girls defeated the Ashland girls last night by a score of 21-20 in one of the hardest fought and most interesting girls' games ever seen in this vicinity. The Ashland team gave the locals a real fight from start to finish and the outcome was doubtful till the end. The game became slightly rough for no girls' game, but few fouls were called.

PASTOR TELLS STAND OF JESUS ON LABOR

COLUMBUS, Ohio, March 6.—If Jesus visited this earth this year He would emphasize the world unity started at the Armament Limitation Conference which met at Washington, would try to inspire love of honest toil and seek reform in large city governments, according to Rev. Dr. Daniel F. Rittenhouse, pastor of the First Baptist church here.

"He would tell the capitalist he cannot gain permanent wealth by refusing fair wages and just working conditions any more than the worker can gain the most desirable returns by endless demands for shorter hours and more pay," continued Rev. Dr. Rittenhouse.

"He would urge a more drastic limitation of armaments, particularly with reference to submarines and poison gas, and He surely would attempt to check the prevailing craze for wasteful pleasures, draining energies of brains and bodies of millions of Americans every day."

FAIRM NEWS

(By County Agent W. B. Conroy).
Growers of cherries, plums, French prunes.
If you have had any San Jose scale, spider mites or twig mites, spray dormant trees with lime-sulphur 3-100.

Brown rot—Don't overlook this spray on above fruits. The time of application should be just when the fruit buds are starting to show white. Use Bordeaux 4-4-50 with a spreader. If you have had any bud moth add in this spray lead arsenate 2-100 plus 2 pounds lime. You can further add blackleaf 2-1000 if aphids have caused any trouble the past season.

To be successful you have to do a careful and thorough job, covering all fruiting limbs with a fine mist spray. This can only be accomplished by using a standard equipment and a knowledge of its use.

If you like to experiment pay no attention to the above article, but check up on results next fall. Results will no doubt look like this: 70, 70, 70.

State Hospital Is Quarantined

SALEM, March 6.—In an effort to forestall an epidemic of influenza at the state hospital the institution was placed under quarantine against all visitors today, according to announcement by Superintendent R. E. Lee Steiner. Only a few minor cases of la grippe and colds have been experienced at the hospital this winter, according to Superintendent Steiner, who explains that epidemics in the institution generally follow several weeks after an epidemic in Salem and surrounding territory. This, Steiner declares, is due to the visits of people to the hospital who are not entirely recovered from the illness, thus spreading the germs among the patients which he is attempting to prevent at this time through a quarantine which it is planned to rigidly maintain so long as there is any danger.

WINDOW SASH CAUSES ARREST

Wilson Thiel, of Yoncalla, was brought to this city today charged with the theft of a window sash from the cabin of Mrs. Myrtle Woods. Thiel volunteered to come to Roseburg without arrest and no warrant was issued for him. The window sash in question was identified by Mrs. Woods as being one in Thiel's garage and was removed and brought in as evidence. At a late hour this afternoon a complaint was being prepared.

PARIS FINDS WAY TO END AUTO SLAUGHTER

PARIS, March 6.—The Prefect of Police of Paris, Robert Loullier, has found a radical means of obliging drivers of motor vehicles in the streets to be more careful. So many accidents to pedestrians have occurred through carelessness that Mr. Loullier has issued instructions that in future when any motor vehicle runs down a pedestrian or is in any way responsible for serious collisions the car shall be confiscated and put under seal and the driver sent to prison.

Should the driver be found guilty he shall serve a term of imprisonment and his car will be sold. If left free he shall be allowed to regain possession of his car and only receive a severe reprimand. These instructions have taught motor drivers in Paris to be extremely cautious.

FRED SHERMAN PASSES AWAY AT MERCY HOSPITAL

Fred Sherman, who had been at Mercy Hospital in this city for the past five days, passed away last night at 8:30. Mr. Sherman was formerly a miner near Grants Pass at a mine about 50 miles from this city. He is not known in this section, and his nearest relative lives in New York state. He was ill but a short time. His body will be shipped to Binghamton, New York, where his sister resides.
