#### British Columbia's Timber.

Directly and indirectly the timber industries of British Columbia represent nearly half the trade and commerce of the province. In 1920 they produced nearly \$83,000,000 worth of commercial material and it is estimated that the 1921 output will run well over the \$100,000,000 mark. The output in 1922 was approximately 2,000,000,000 feet of wood products, and over 20,000 men were employed to produce this quantity.

#### Those Subnormal Children.

In an address to the physicians of Peoria Dr. Borden Veeder of Washington university, St. Louis, said: "The fallacy of setting arbitrary standards for the weight and height of children without reference to their parentage is a practice which should be abolished. In judging whether a child is above or below normal the stature and weight of the parents should be considered."
