GRANTS PASS TO BE HERE SUNDAY

Roseburg-Legion Team Will Play Southern Aggregation at Laurelwood.

BIG CROWD EXPECTED

Old Sol Promises Some Real Sunshine—Roseburg Team Considers Entering Willamette Valley League—Good Games Scheduled.

The Roseburg-Legion baseball team will have the fight of their young lives Sunday afternoon when they clash with the mighty Rogue River warriors from Grants Pass. Manager Vic Peterson and Captain Rudy Ritzman are not over-confident but they feel that their team will annex the scalps of the southern slab artists when tomorrow's contest is staged. Grants Pass recently defeated Medford and since that victory they have been traveling the rosy path—but the Roseburg aggregation will toss a few thorns beneath their spikes, according to the opinion expressed by fans who have watched both organizations at work.

Tomorrow's game will be called promptly at 2:30 o'clock. Admission to the Laurelwood baseball park will be 35 cents for adults and all children under the age of 14 years will be admitted free of charge.

Famous Pitcher Coming. The famous ex-Detroit and coast league pitcher, Fernoll, will occupy the mound for the Grants Pass troupe. Fernoll is considered to be one of the best semi-professional pitchers in the valley at the present time and the Umpqua valley lads are picking the heaviest slabs in hopes of pounding out a few homers. Pruitt will receive for Grants Pass. He is said to be a classy catcher and a man who is on the job at every stage of the game. The remainder of the Grants Pass lineup has not been divulged.

Captain Ritzman will pitch Billy Anderson, the boy with a future and a past full of victories. Bill has laid in a large supply of "chawin'" and states that his arm is in the best of condition. "Bug" Miller will receive as usual—and that means a humdinger of a battery for the home team. Both of the boys are in prime condition and "rarin' to go."

Tomorrow's Lineup. The lineup for tomorrow's game will probably be as follows: Cedarstrom, short stop; Althaus, first base; Jim Goodman, right field; Glen Smith, left field; Fry (Grimm), second base; "Bug" Miller, catcher; Curran, third base; Billy Anderson, pitcher; Bill Riebel, center field.

A record breaking crowd is expected for the game and the grand stand will undoubtedly be packed. Big shade trees will protect the remainder of the spectators from the rays of Old Sol, who has promised to be "on deck" in time for the start of the first inning.

Will Join League. Captain Rudy Ritzman returned this morning from Eugene where he attended a meeting of all the managers and captains of the upper Willamette valley baseball teams with a view of organizing a league. Ritzman reported today that the meeting was a most enthusiastic one and that many attended and expressed their willingness to join the league. Roseburg will probably sign up in the league, thus assuring the local fans of a game on the home lot every other Sunday. The opening day will be Sunday, May 21st, when the fast Goshen team will meet the Roseburg team on the Laurelwood grounds. Goshen is considered the strongest contender for the championship of the league and the local boys declare they will put up a strenuous fight for the pennant.

President Elected. At the meeting last night, Mr. George Wilhelm, a Harrisburg banker, was elected president of the league. The board of directors consists of the managers of each team. Each team must post a \$50 bond to assure the playing out of the schedule, which will be announced shortly.

Not Import Players. The importation of professional ball players will be barred, and several clauses in the by-laws deal with that phase. The admission price to all the league games will be 35 cents and children under 12 years of age admitted free.

"This will give Roseburg some real baseball," said Manager Peterson today. "We will place a team in the field that will be a strong contender for the championship. It also assures the fans of some real games in this city."

The winners of the upper Willamette valley league pennant will then compete for state honors at the close of the season.

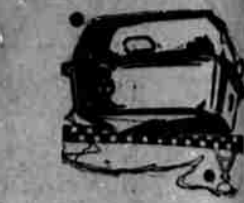
