FALSE MOTHER WHO DUPED LOVER FACES LONG PRISON TERM

PARIS, June 13.—To keep alive the interest of the man she loved she stole a baby and told him it was her own. Now Leonie Ducios, loveless, childless, wrecked, must spend two years in prison to expiate her crime.

At the age of sixteen Leonie was betrayed and abandoned by a handsome Greek. After that her life was sordid and miserable until, just after the war, she met M. Chavanne, of Lyons, for whom she conceived a passion such as comes only once even to girls like Leonie.

But Chavanne was a man, and under the French moral code irresponsible so far as Leonie was concerned. He tired of his plaything, gradually, and one day he spoke of leaving her forever.

Leonie, maddened by her love, became desperate.

"There is going to be a child," she whispered to Chavanne.

The ruse worked. Some time later Leonie came to Paris, ostensibly to seek a nurse for her child. She found Mme. Passeton, mother of a healthy infant, and offered her a large sum to act as nurse.

Mme. Passeton consented and agreed to submit to an examination by a physician. During the examination Leonie disappeared with the child.

For a time all went well. But Chavanne began to suspect, and three months later, after the death of the baby, he instituted investigations. Leonie, feeling she was suspected, fled to Marseilles, where she attempted vainly to commit suicide and was finally arrested.

The two mothers—real and bogus—faced each other in the court room during a dramatic trial.

After sentence was passed, Leonie was asked if she had anything to say. "My only wish is not to leave this room without a word of forgiveness from the mother I have wronged," she said.

The silence that followed was only interrupted by the order to conduct the prisoner to her cell.

CHINESE SLAYER GETS CLEMENCY FROM COURT

WASHINGTON, June 13.—Liang Sung Wan, Chinese student, convicted of killing Ben Sun, an under secretary to the Chinese Educational Mission, in 1919 will not be executed until November 17 next.

Justice McCoy, presiding in the Criminal Court here, granted the Chinese youth the stay because of an appeal pending before the Court of Appeals. He was to have been executed June 2.

That old weather-beaten sea dog, "Cappy Ricks," is steering his ship this way, and comes into port the fifth night of Chautauqua when the Vivian Players will present the play of that name, and it is expected to prove one of the most delightful treats of the season.

The "Cappy Ricks" stories appeared in the Saturday Evening Post for quite a period, and the author, Peter B. Kyne, knew his types, for he spent his spare hours for several years along the San Francisco waterfront, virtually living with the characters he later weaved into the stories.
