field. He spent 15 years and \$100,000 in testing his ramjet and kites, and established a reputation in architecture, the use of metal cells or units.

Throughout his life, Dr. Bell maintained his interest and later in deaf-mutes. He founded, became president and contributed \$125,000 to the American Association to Promote Teaching of Speech to the Deaf. He is a member of many of the most prominent American learned societies.

Dr. Bell's laboratories have been located since 1886 near Lake Umbagog in Cape Breton. There for many years he conducted research and experiments in aerial locomotion and scientific subjects and maintained a private museum showing the development of his greatest invention.

He encouraged Samuel P. Langley to build the first flying machine, which he declared after witnessing its flight at Antietam, Virginia, in 1896, that the airplane was at hand.

Dr. Bell formed in 1907 the Aeronautical Association with headquarters in Cape Breton, and he was with the machines designed by that association that the most successful public flights in America were made.

In the world war, Dr. Bell and Baldwin invented a boat called the Hydrodrome which developed a speed of 10 miles an hour, and was the fastest in the world. It used a plane propeller and carried with it a series of planes which its main body above the water speed increased. It was used for submarine chasing and some other purposes.
