that they are unable to get deliveries of any kind. That they cannot reach their property with their automobiles and that their property has a slight value because of the lack of improvement. The opposition on the other hand, introduced figures showing that the lots 25x100 feet will have improvements amounting to more than \$1,000 and that the property owners will be forced to abandon them to the city.

Both sides argued at great length and with considerable heat. Miss Page and Mr. Sutherland were present with a plat of the property while Mrs. Hatfield, and R. L. Collins were strong supporters of the paving proposition. After a great deal of argument it was decided to pave the street from East Third street to the east line of the alleyway, leaving one-half of the block between the alley and Jackson street unpaved. This will give an outlet on East Third street and will permit the residents to drive out by that way, and at the same time will not confiscate the two lots on the corner.

Frank Neuner appeared before the council on behalf of the Armistice Day committee and asked that the council refrain from granting concessions to any persons except the American Legion on the holiday. He states that the local post is going to a great deal of expense this year in putting on a good celebration and is arranging for a fine day of entertainment. In order to defray expenses it is necessary, he says, that the Legion have control of all dance concessions and other amusements and that all others be barred. As this is a day for ex-service men and as the ex-service men are officially represented by the American Legion he asked that there be no concessions granted to other parties. The request was granted unanimously with all of the councilmen trying to place the motion.

A motorbus license was granted to L. L. Hilbard.

The petition for the placing of the fire engine measure upon the ballot at the coming election was read and considered. The petition asked for a bond issue of \$15,000 but Mayor Hamilton stated that a fire engine would cost only \$13,000 and that he believed that measure would stand a better chance of passage if the amount should be kept as low as possible. He stated that there is a great need for this apparatus and that everything possible should be done to put the measure in a favorable light and that no excess bonds should be issued. In the event other apparatus and equipment is needed it can be provided from the general fund, he stated. The city attorney was instructed to prepare an ordinance placing the matter on the ballot.

The usual monthly reports were read and the bills allowed. Plans and specifications for the improvement of Military street were read and adopted. The estimated cost is \$5,985.06. The plans were also adopted for the pavement of Corev avenue the estimated cost being \$4,140.96.

The quarterly allowance of \$150 was ordered paid to the Douglas County Concert Band.

At this meeting it became necessary to appoint the annual budget committee. Under the local ordinance for this work each councilman selected a man to represent him and the following were appointed: A. G. Sutherland, Al. Creason, George Neuner, D. R. Shambrook, Dexter Rice, J. W. Perkins, A. C. Masters and Hyman Wollenberg.

An ordinance providing for the paving of Flint street was placed on first and second readings.

The Mayor was instructed to purchase a heating plant for the firemen's club rooms.
