**PROPOSED INCREASE IN
PHONE RATES WITHDRAWN**

(By Associated Press.)
OLYMPIA, Wn., Oct. 6.—The proposed general increase in exchange telephone rates is now withdrawn and cancelled in all cities in the state except Seattle, Tacoma and Spokane, the department of public works announced today upon receiving notice from the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company and the Home Telephone and Telegraph company of Spokane. In addition the companies filed revision of the toll rate schedule conforming with the pre-war toll rates as ordered by the department at the time of increased rates, which approximated 31 per cent were suspended.

**U. of O. Alumni
Meet at Banquet**

secretary-treasurer.

While President Campbell outlined in most complete detail the plan of the campaign, which is largely educational, aiming to acquaint the people of Oregon with the rapid growth of the university, others discussed phases of the campaign. Captain Lamar Tooez, '16, spoke of the definite obligation of alumni to support their Alma Mater. O. P. Coshaw expressed the opinion that an endowment plan to meet university development was wise. It took account of the fact that the people of Oregon have supported higher education loyally and that private benefactions must care for new buildings within the next few years.

Judge Hamilton, president of the board of regents, and who presided last night, spoke of the great service of the university to the state. He discussed the recent rapid growth of the institution and its needs. Unless an endowment fund is created through private gifts the university is faced with a definite limitation of enrollment or of a lowering of standards. Speaking as a member of the board, he declared that neither of these expedients would be acceptable. To limit registration by imposing a comparatively high entrance fee would bar the young men and women of limited means from entering the university. To lower standards would place Oregon in second place among the universities of the country.

"We want everyone to have an understanding of the great significance of education in the state," said President Campbell, "the absolute, imperative necessity of education. The success of the University of Oregon is based on cooperative effort, the individual home joining hands with the board of regents, the executive officers and the faculty."

"The great irresistible tide for education which is flowing through the country finds its origin about the fireside of thousands of homes as Sir James Barrie so aptly put it recently when discussing university education in Scotland. The American family desires a broad, liberal and ample opportunity for higher education for its children."

"Perhaps another reason for the desire of our mature citizens to see to it that the future leaders of America have a sound educational training is that, since the war, we have come to a realization that civilization has not measured up to the point of safety. The future of civilization, the safety of the world, the prosperity of every nation, rests with education. Statesmen, writers, legislators; in fact, all leaders, are pointing this out."

"There cannot be wholesale higher education, said the speaker, if the old values gained through personal contact of teacher and student are to maintain. The pressure must be relieved with increased facilities. President Campbell pointed out that in spite of interest in higher education, recent figures of the U. S. department of Education show that less than 1 per cent of the population in America is availing itself of the facilities of higher education. Oregon is among the leaders educationally."

"In the last two years the University of Oregon has been able to devote \$500,000 of millage money to new buildings," said President Campbell. "But enrollment has crept up until it is taking nearly the whole millage fund to take care of the students."

"The university could use several million, in addition to the millage support, to the very best advantage for new buildings and other development," President Campbell declared.

"The university, for example, is badly in need of a new library," he said. "The present structure was built to accommodate 600 students, and all its facilities are greatly overtaxed. We require a new auditorium, new accommodations for science students, and other physical equipment, as well as funds for fellowship and research."

It was because of these needs that the campaign for private gifts was launched, with the alumni in united support of the plan. The campaign, it was pointed out, will be in no sense a drive. Rather, it will be a campaign of education. It is hoped that when the needs of the university are known, gifts will be forthcoming.

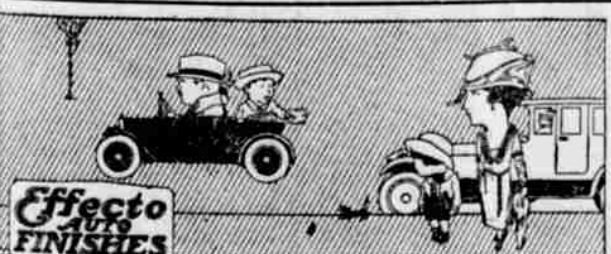
