**MARSHFIELD, Oct. 12.**—A. K. Peck in behalf of a few who are endeavoring to resuscitate the Southwestern Oregon Daily News today made a payment of \$1,000 to stay the mortgage foreclosure proceedings of the Bennett Trust company.

A condition of the payment was that they be allowed until November 1 in which to raise \$1500 more due on the mortgage. By the terms of the deal, they are agreeing to pay \$5000 for the property. This is just prior to the election so that the deal gives them control of the paper practically until election time.

The new company is incorporated for \$15,000, it is said.

Today Mr. Peck and Fred Wilson, the undertaker, were reported to be endeavoring to sell stock in the undertaking at \$5 per share, twenty per cent cash. They were reported to be promising that they would also give advertising space equivalent to the subscription to those who desired it.

Their proposition was not dissimilar to that made by the Rev. Jesse T. Anderson when he sold stock in the project a couple of years ago to local business men.

Later, Walter Wells, who sub-leases the quarters to the News, and O. K. Hultin were also endeavoring to aid Mr. Peck in selling stock.
