Clyde Gazley Faces Boze Charge

A complaint was sworn out today against Clyde Gazley of Gazley, Oregon, as a result of the discovery of a partly-filled jug of moonshine under his bed when officers searched his home last night.

According to Sheriff Starmer, Gazley has been reported intoxicated on several occasions recently, and last night Deputies Hopkins, Shambrook and Hodges went to the Gazley home and made a search of the premises. They reported the finding of a gallon-jug containing about a pint of liquor, and also a quantity of sour mash which they believe he had expected to make into liquor. The jug was found under his bed and the mash in a tool house.

Gazley was not home at the time, but his mother informed the officers that he will make his appearance before Justice of the Peace George Jones, and so he was not located nor placed under arrest.

Gazley was concerned in another boze case a short time ago when he and a companion were apprehended with a jug of liquor in their car. They smashed the evidences, but they were placed under arrest and brought to Roseburg and paid fines in the justice court.
