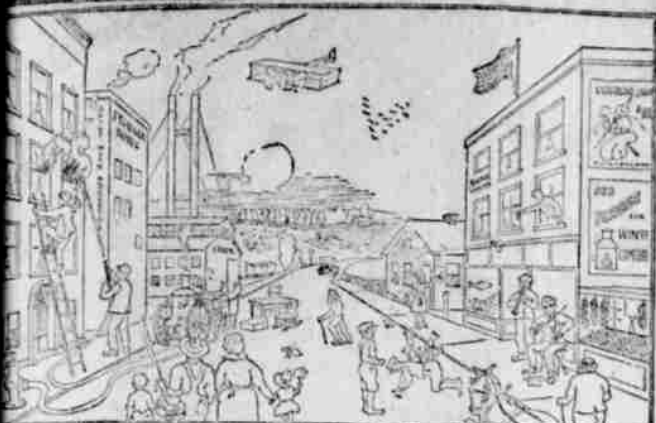

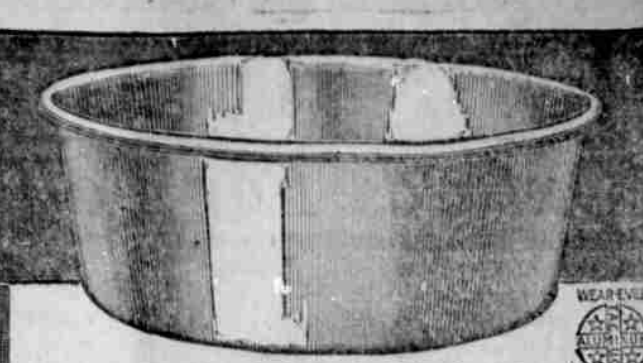

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18.-Evidence of the increasing prosperity and thrift of the public was reflected in the reports received last June from national banks relating particularly to the number of savings accounts and savings deposits, said a statement issued today by comptroller of the currency Crisler.

The number of savings depositors increased 764,085 and the amount of the deposits \$88,499,000 as compared with June 1921. The total of such deposits in the national banks was \$3,046,054,000 and the number of depositors was 8,873,327.
