

beginning of winter, but partially dormant, until early, when it starts to mature and harvest. It is packed in crates and shipped to eastern markets in bulk, finding a ready market and a return of \$1.50 per crate. The crop will be about 300 crates per acre. Profit is \$100 to \$115 per acre. About 100 acres are planted near Roseburg, 500 acres in the county. It is expected that there will be 1000 acres next year. The district is made very widely to market, being shipped to all sections of the east. It is expected that this crop will be one of the most important of the many products of Roseburg valley, now well developed farms, with a wide variety of crops, not many years ago mostly waste land, or used for stock. Land was sold at an acre. The building of a highway has done much to develop that section, and a good market roads is now being built.

Roseburg valley has a rainfall to ours, with an elevation of 500 feet. The climate is without extreme heat in summer and seldom snowing in winter.

Being me by letter at my office, block, Portland, we will purchase necessary articles for the education of their several children at no cost or publicity, this will be to race, creed or color, our policy in the matter being to do all times the full and complete execution of our instructions and by the free public schools."
