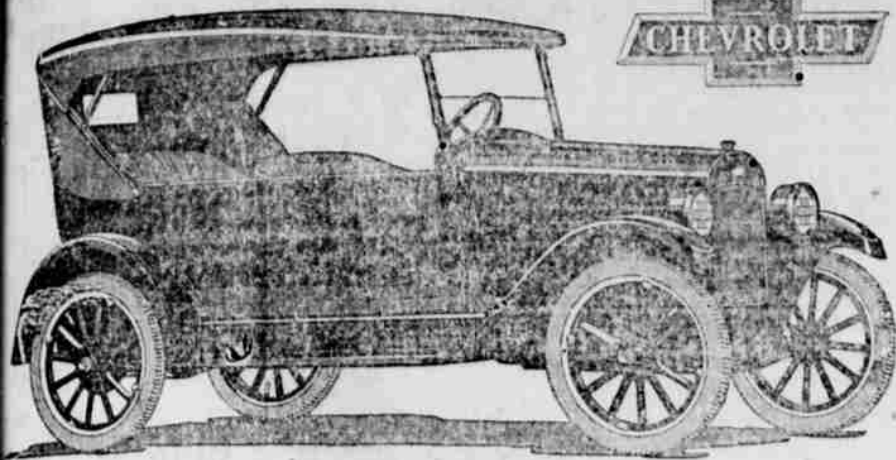

Espee Employees to Hold Meeting

The employees of the Southern Pacific for the past year and a half have been conducting a campaign on their own initiative to reduce the loss and damage to freight by conferring among themselves, pointing out mishandling, when found, and suggesting better and safer methods. This campaign of education has resulted in reducing loss and damage claims very materially and has been the subject of much favorable comment on the part of Roseburg merchants.

In this connection a get-together meeting of employees throughout the Portland division will be held at the city council chambers at the city hall in Roseburg, on Friday, November 24, beginning at 9:30 a. m. It is expected that there will be an attendance of fully 100 employees and officials from various points throughout the Portland division and it is also expected that R. G. Pagan, superintendent of freight protection, from San Francisco, and E. L. King, division superintendent of Portland, will be in attendance. L. B. Moore, the local agent of the Southern Pacific, is chairman of the organization formed by the employees on the Portland division.

Rod And Gun Club Is Formed

A preliminary meeting of the Rod and Gun club which is being formed in this city was held last night at the Broadway garage. A great deal of interest and enthusiasm was shown and over 35 members have already signed up with the organization, while Yoncalla, Sutherlin, Oakland, Riddle and Myrtle Creek will also be represented by marksmen from those localities.

The government rifle range will be used for the club's shoots if permission can be secured. The club will meet at Crocker's drug store Friday evening, at 7:30, for the purpose of forming a permanent organization.

Father Wants Child Killed

CHICAGO, Nov. 21.—A father's plea that his two-day-old deformed baby girl be scientifically put to death was overruled by physicians today.

The child, mentally normal, has neither arms nor legs. The father, James C. Lebrasca, begged that she "be allowed not to live," according to surgeons.

The case of baby Bellinger that was scientifically allowed to die seven years ago after the late Dr. Harry Halden, attending physician, refused to perform a simple operation that would have saved the child's life, was recalled.

Baby Lebrasca was born Saturday, Dr. Ben H. Breakstone, attending physician, after a consultation with his colleagues, ruled against the father's appeal.

"The child's brain is normal. It may become a mental genius and we have no right to cause her death," he said.

"The deciding point is whether the child, if permitted to live, will be a burden on the community."

"Society should be required to step in and care for such a baby, attend to its wants and educate it."

Big Timber Deal Completed

EUGENE, Nov. 21.—One of the biggest timber transactions in recent months has been consummated here with the trading of interlocking tracts by the Continental Timber company, of Delaware, and the Drew Timber company, of Iowa. The timber is situated in both Lane and Linn counties, and lies in township 15, south range, three east, on the Cascade north and east of Vida.

Both companies in Oregon are timber holding concerns, and are among the largest in the state. The Drew people are now operating in Iowa, Minnesota and other states. About a year ago they made a similar trade with the Ho Th-Kelly company, and now have a great tract of fine timber high on the
