VALUATION OF STATE LOWER

State Tax Commission Report Shows Decrease Oregon's Assessed Valuation.

UTILITIES ARE REDUCED

State Tax Commission Reduces Valuation of Public Utilities to Equalize Assessment Rates in the State.

SALEM, Nov. 28.—The assessed valuation of all property in the state for 1922 shows a decrease of \$11,205,000.72 as compared to the valuations for 1921, according to figures compiled by Frank A. Lovell, state tax commissioner.

The taxable value of all property in the state this year is \$1,809,459,166.38 as compared to \$1,820,664,127.10 in 1921. The aggregate value of all taxable property with the exception of public utilities, is \$897,422,724.97 as compared to \$885,792,097.81 last year.

Utility Values Higher The apportioned value of public utilities in Oregon for 1921, upon which taxes will be based, aggregates \$123,707,064.60, reduced from an actual cash value of \$189,359,984.60 to correspond to the assessment of other property.
