PORTLAND, Nov. 29.—Alex Sparrow, superintendent of Crater Lake National park, is in Portland to spend the Thanksgiving holiday. Sparrow is boasting that during the past summer more than 33,000 tourists learned of the charming scenic lake, and he expects the number to increase rapidly hereafter. The ride by automobile between Crater lake and Medford was done in four hours, and by further improvement of the highway next year it will be cut to three hours, Sparrow says. Klamath Falls is only two hours' ride from Crater lake, and many Californians enter that way, he observed.

KLAN ADOPTS NEW CONSTITUTION

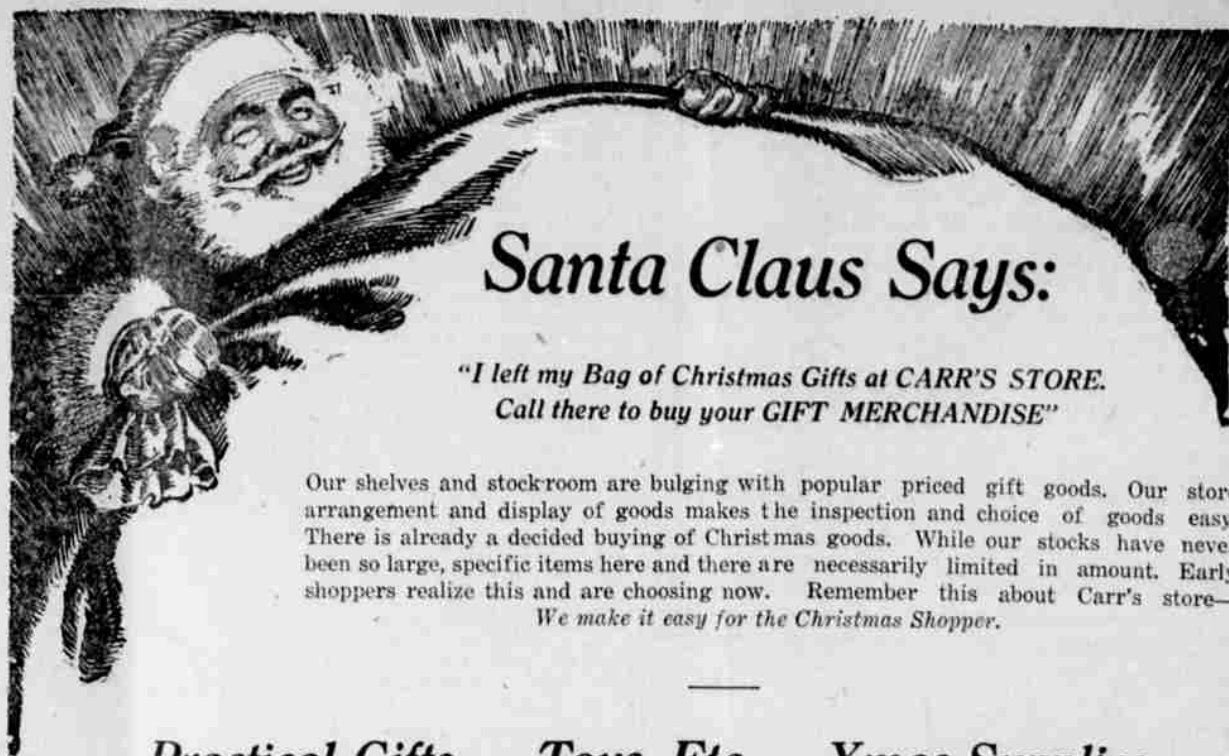
(The Associated Press.) ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 26.—The Imperial Klonoization of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan was formally closed today. A new constitution, with a clause prohibiting Klan affiliation with any woman's organization and carrying the penalty of banishment from the Invisible Empire for anyone who aids or abets such an organization was adopted. The new constitution also provides that the Imperial Wizard hereafter shall be elected by the Grand Dragons or state chiefs.

GENERALS UNDER ARREST AT ATHENS

(The Associated Press.) LONDON, Nov. 26.—A Reuters' dispatch from Athens says that General Papadopoulos, Donamantis and Vassilas have been arrested. General Donamantis was appointed commander in chief last September in an unsuccessful attempt to stem the tide of the Turkish advance in Asia Minor. General Papadopoulos, also a former commander of the Greek army, was reported last September to have joined the revolutionaries. He was called as a witness at the trial of the six cabinet members who were executed Tuesday.

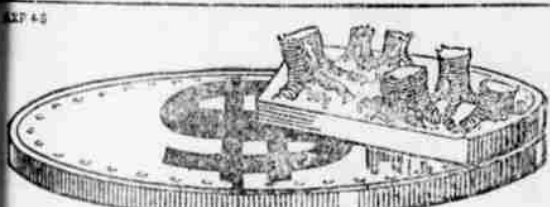
