Motor License Rush Will Start Soon

SALEM, Dec. 7.—The annual warning to "get your motor license early" was issued by Secretary of State Koser today.

The issuance of automobile licenses at the close of the year for use during the new year has always been attended by considerable confusion in the last few days of the year, due to the tendency on the part of motor vehicle owners to procrastinate in the filing of their applications.

But this year the eleventh hour confusion promises to be greater than ever before and those who delay until the last minute in getting their applications in may find it necessary to keep their cars in the garage pending the ability of the motor registration department to get to their case.

Notwithstanding the fact that there are 15,000 more automobiles in the state at this time than there were a year ago, Koser points out, there have been fewer applications for new licenses filed up to date than had been received up to this time last year.

"There seems to be a growing tendency on the part of the motor vehicle owner to defer taking steps toward the renewal of his motor vehicle license," Koser declares. "This means that there will be a congestion in the motor vehicle division of the department around the first of the year as to make it impossible to issue licenses promptly upon receipt of the application."

Koser points out that it is economically unwise and physically impossible to maintain a trained force large enough to meet every demand made upon the department unless the motor vehicle owners will cooperate with the department by spreading their applications out over a period of several weeks time.

Mailing of the new license plates will begin on December 12, but motorists are warned against using the new plates before January 1 or the old plates after that date.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE FIRST AVENUE NORTH.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That at a meeting of the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, held on the 4th day of December, 1922, the following resolution was adopted: "Resolved, That the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner, deem it expedient and necessary and hereby proposes to improve First Avenue North between the west line of East Third Street and the east line of North Jackson Street, in the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner:

First: By grading said street to the proper sub-grade;

Second: By paving the roadway of said street twenty feet in width with concrete pavement;

Third: By constructing sub-drains, if necessary;

Fourth: By constructing street monuments;

Fifth: By constructing concrete curbs;

Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe if necessary;

Seventh: By constructing catch-basins and inlets.

Said improvements are to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, and the grade, plans, and specifications and estimates of the City Engineer, filed in the office of the City Recorder on the 4th day of December, 1922, which said grade, plans, specifications and estimates are hereby approved and adopted.

The entire cost of said improvement, including engineering, interest, and all other expenses incident to the improvement of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, shall be assessed upon the property especially benefited thereby as provided by the Charter of said City, and in accordance with the petition of the property owners to be filed with the said improvement, and no part thereof shall be paid by the City of Roseburg.

The estimate of the City Engineer of the probable cost of said improvement is the sum of \$5000.25.

RESOLVED, that the City Recorder of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, be and he is hereby directed to give notice of said improvement as provided by the Charter of said City.

Remonstrances against said proposed improvement may be filed with the undersigned within twenty days from the first publication of this notice which is the 7th day of December, 1922.

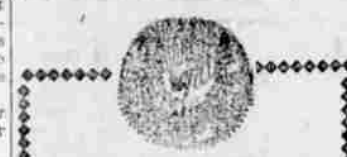
