"The Gold Diggers" Delightful Play

Theatre goers were delighted last night with "The Gold Diggers" the David Belasco production, presented at the Antlers Theatre. The theatre was well filled considering the many other attractions that have been presented this week and the audience was kept convulsed with laughter by the clever sayings and fine acting. The plot in itself was very unique and strictly modern. It had to do with the life of the New York chorus girls known as "gold diggers," a name applied to those whose chief employment in leisure hours in the coaxing of as much money as possible from the pockets of their well-to-do admirers and putting the same into immediate circulation with lavish and extravagant hands.

"Jerry Lamar," the character played by Miss Gertrude Vanderbilt, is of rather more serious bent than her companions, and by her cleverness and generosity manages to bring a happy ending to the love affair of her friends and at the same time overcome the opposition of the guardian uncle and land him as her own matrimonial prize.

The tale is unfolded with a wealth of satirical humor and jollity and yet there are many serious sides of life depicted as well. Pathos and human sympathy are painted throughout in brilliant strokes, but always the dramatic, or pathetic is relieved sharply by striking wit and humor which sways the audience from the hint of tragedy to the blithesome and whimsical humor of life.

The members of the troupe were particularly well cast and the acting throughout was perfect. The play was strictly high class and above the average generally brought to cities the size of Roseburg. The management of the Antlers Theatre is deserving of much credit for bringing to the play lovers of this city a production of such standing.
