OPPOSITION TO TRUCK LOAD LIMIT

Claim Is Made That Action Restricting Loads Will Stop Mills.

DAMAGE IS FORESEEN

Small Trucks and Wagons With Narrow Tires Can Be Loaded To Limit and Will Destroy Road Surface It Is Alleged

That the order of the county court limiting truck weights to 5,000 pounds, completely throttles all small industry in the country and practically prohibits the operation of any truck larger than a Ford truck, is the statement made by men engaged in hauling and particularly those interested in the lumber industry. The limit the court has placed will result in more damage to the roads than would be done by the heavy trucks, they allege. The average ton and a half truck will weigh around 4,000 pounds. It is claimed and consequently can carry only about 1,000 pound load.

This will mean that all hauling must be done by Ford trucks, which are much lighter, or by wagons. These Ford trucks and wagons have a very narrow tire width and will cut deeply into the road and will destroy the surface within a very short time. On the other hand the big trucks with their wide tires, if not overloaded, serve to pack down the surface and do much less damage than the vehicles with the narrow tires.

The Ford Trucks have a total tire width of about 5 inches as compared with 16 inches of the surface, carried by the average ton and a half truck. It is the contention of men engaged in hauling that the load limit should be passed on the tire width of the vehicles and should vary according to the condition of the roads in various localities.

The order will completely stop the operation of the small saw mills throughout the county, it is stated, and will also prevent the farmers from hauling in heavy loads of produce. It will probably result in an increase in the cost of wood for fuel and will serve to throttle the small industries and throw a number of persons out of employment. Some immediate modification of the order is urged by these men.

SCHOOL DIRECTORY OF OREGON DISTRIBUTED

SALEM, Dec. 12.—Oregon's official school directory, a compilation of valuable information concerning the schools of the state, is being distributed by J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of public instruction. The directory contains a list of all superintendents, principals and high school teachers, a tabulation of the standard high schools with the number of teachers, enrollment, assessed valuation, number of mills of special tax levied and the amount of indebtedness in each district. The rules governing the standardization of four-year high schools and lists of required apparatus and library books are included.

McNARY DENIES HE MIGHT TAKE PLACE ON FEDERAL BENCH

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—Unqualified denial of reports that he might accept the appointment on the federal bench was coupled with announcement of determination to seek another term in the senate, in a statement issued by Senator McNary today. His statement says: "For some unknown reason a rumor persists in Oregon that I am going to leave the senate and accept a judicial position. The rumor is baseless. I have not been tendered a position on the federal bench and I would not accept such an appointment if tendered. Five and a half years of service in the United States senate has brought me the committee assignments and positions the one which I believe are of real value to the west, and I would not forego this opportunity to be useful for any judicial position in the gift of the president. I intend to remain in the senate the whole of my present term, and another, if agreeable to the people of my state."
