Probably the west's best known athlete is Jack Dempsey, heavyweight boxing champion. Colorado and Utah-born, Dempsey now resides in Los Angeles. Although did little this year in the ring, only because a capable opponent could not be found.

World honors also came to the men in wrestling when Ed (Strangler) Lewis of San Jose, Cal., won heavyweight title from Stanislas Zhyzko to whom he had lost earlier. Lewis formerly was a member of Kentucky but in recent years has made his home in California.

In the automobile speedway of California, a native Californian, Sam Murphy, whose residence is in Los Angeles and who has been in the championship ring, taking the title from the Californian, Tommy Mitchell.

In college athletics the University of California retained its title of national intercollegiate track and field champion at Harvard last year. Jack Merchant, Californian, the individual star, his work in hammer, discus, jumps and shot causing easterners to call him the greatest all-around athlete of the year. Stanford University placed third in the Harvard meet.

At the Harvard meet, man and woman, making many of the Cardinal points. In track also, Bud Fisher, Oxford, Cal., high school star, won the national interscholastic 100 yard sprint. Sprinkle is still trying to break the 100 yard sprint record made in 1911 by Charles Paddock, Los Angeles, the world's fastest human being. California this year produced another great football team, said by many to be even greater than the "under team" of 1921 which included Ohio State, Big Ten champion, "Breck" Muller, California's American end, and "Duke" Morgan, an All-American possibility, stars on the team.

Western baseball players this year brought prices higher than ever paid to minor league players. Jimmy O'Connell and William of the San Francisco team and Sammy Hale of the Grand Beavers were sold for \$100,000 and \$75,000 respectively. The Golden State

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE FIRST AVENUE NORTH.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That at a meeting of the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, held on the 4th day of December, 1922, the following resolution was adopted: "RESOLVED, that the Common Council, Oregon, in the following manner, deem it expedient and necessary and hereby propose to improve First Avenue North between the west line of East Third Street and the east line of North Jackson Street, in the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner: First: By grading said street to the proper sub-grade; Second: By paving the roadway of said street twenty feet in width with concrete pavement; Third: By constructing sub-drains, if necessary; Fourth: By constructing street monuments; Fifth: By constructing concrete curbs; Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe if necessary; Seventh: By constructing catch-basins and inlets.

Said improvements are to be made in accordance with the Charter and ordinances of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, and the grade, plans, and specifications and estimates of the City Engineer, filed in the office of the City Recorder on the 4th day of December, 1922, which said grade, plans, specifications and estimates are hereby approved and adopted.

The entire cost of said improvement, including engineering, interest, and all other expenses which the City of Roseburg would not have incurred except for the making of said improvement, shall be assessed upon the property especially benefited thereby, as provided by the Charter of said City, and in accordance with the petition of the property owners to be benefited by said improvement, and no part thereof shall be paid by the City of Roseburg.

The estimate of the City Engineer of the probable detailed cost of said improvement is in the sum of \$4900.55. RESOLVED, that the City Recorder of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, be and he is hereby directed to give notice of said improvement as provided by the Charter of said City.

Remonstrances against said proposed improvement may be filed with the undersigned within twenty days from the first publication of this notice which is the 7th day of December, 1922.

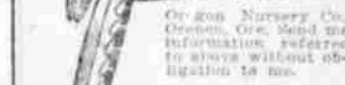

FRUIT MEN OF AMERICA WATCH OREGON RESEARCH

"You have something in your horticultural products investigations no other institution in the United States has," writes C. I. Lewis, managing editor of the "American Fruit Grower," Chicago. The Fruit Grower has just published a three-page illustrated article on the work of the experiment station laboratory in better canning, drying and otherwise preserving perishable fruits and vegetables, including the new rodentication prune drier. The editor says this story is very interesting and readable and will be of interest to growers all over the country.

"I believe you would do well to give a great deal of publicity to this work because there is tremendous interest in it all over the United States," the editor writes. "I have been hoping it will be supported in a nice way on the experimental side so you can go ahead and capitalize the present building for experiments as well as teaching."

This new work was started a few years ago and has already developed many new facts of interest about jam, jelly and dried products, and closer use of culls and waste products of manufacture. E. H. Wiegand is in charge.
