ASKS RENEWAL OF 13-CENT STAMP

(By Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, Dec. 14—

Postmaster General Work has
from members of the
tory class of the
State Normal School,
West Virginia, a
petition that
postoffice Department
stamp of the thirteen
cent denomination,
which was recently
abandoned.

The petition declares that
the entire history of the
United States is bound
up in the figure 13 and
gives the following
historical reasons why
the thirteen cent stamp
should be issued:

America was discovered on
the night of the thirteenth
of the month.

The republic originally
consisted of thirteen
colonies.

The first official flag had
thirteen stars and
thirteen stripes.

The American flag
requires thirteen letters
to spell it as does the
motto, "E Pluribus Unum."

The first west to east
trans-atlantic cable was
transmitted on the
thirteenth of the month.

The silver quarter is
written all over with
thirteen. Around the
head of Liberty are
thirteen stars; the
eagle bears in its
beak thirteen leaves
in one claw and
thirteen thunderbolts
in the other. On
his breast is a shield
bearing thirteen
bars and in his beak
is a ribbon bearing
the motto with
thirteen letters; each
wing has thirteen
feathers and it takes
thirteen letters to
spell quarter dollar.

There are thirteen letters
in the name of
Paul Jones.

There were thirteen
ships in the first
American navy.

Perry's victory on
Lake Erie was won
on the thirteenth of
the month.

The stars and stripes
were first hoisted
over Fort Sumter on
the thirteenth of
the month.

Gen. Pershing arrived
in France on June
13, 1917.

The thirteenth
amendment to the
constitution freed
the slaves.

It would not cost
any more to issue
a thirteen cent stamp
than to issue one.

commemorative of
the thirteen colonies.

had been
cached under
an old tree
in the
vicinity of
the city. This
loot consisted
of the most
part of a
large number
of ivory
toilet
articles and
silver
jewelry,
the jewelry

been
removed.

So far no
trace of
Green
or Kelly,
who
escaped
by

has
been
found.
