DENTISTS OFFER

PRIZES FOR ESSAYS

Valuable Prizes to Be Distributed Among School Children of All Counties for Best Essays on Care of Teeth.

Because of the educational value it will have in showing the relation between good health and good teeth, the Oregon State Board of Dental Examiners, will conduct an essay contest through all the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades of the public schools of the state. The contest has been given the approval of the Oregon Department of Education as it is believed that conservation of health may be promoted through the proper care of the teeth. The teachers are urged to make the contest valuable also as an exercise in language and conduct drills in both written and oral expression.

Each first class district in each county is a contest unit while each district outside of those of the first class are also separate units. The prizes are divided between these two classes, prizes of \$10 being given for the best essays from the fifth and sixth grades combined and the seventh and eighth grades combined in districts of the first class and a similar prize for the two grade divisions in the outside districts. This new writing form \$10 prizes in each county. Each state prize of \$25 each will be shown on the prize lists. The fifth and sixth grades being divided into one class while the seventh and eighth grades are also made into one class.

Prizes in the fifth and sixth grades are to be given in "How good teeth may be kept healthy" and "How poor teeth may be kept healthy." The purpose of the contest is to make each child realize that good teeth are not only a matter of pride but a matter of health. The prizes are to be distributed to the schools of the county as soon as possible to the county school superintendent.

C. OF C. SECRETARIES TO MEET IN EUGENE

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Mar. 1.—(Special).—Dates for the third annual meeting of the Oregon Chapter of Commerce Secretaries will be April 2 to 7, according to an announcement made here today. The meetings are held each year under the auspices of the school of business administration of the University of Oregon.

A course in business and commercial work is scheduled. Members of the faculty of the school of business administration and other professors and outside lecturers will conduct the courses. Approximately fifty secretaries are expected.

The course will be divided into three sections: that which concerns the secretaries themselves; that which involves the community as a whole; and club technique. Special emphasis will be placed this year on problems of state development.

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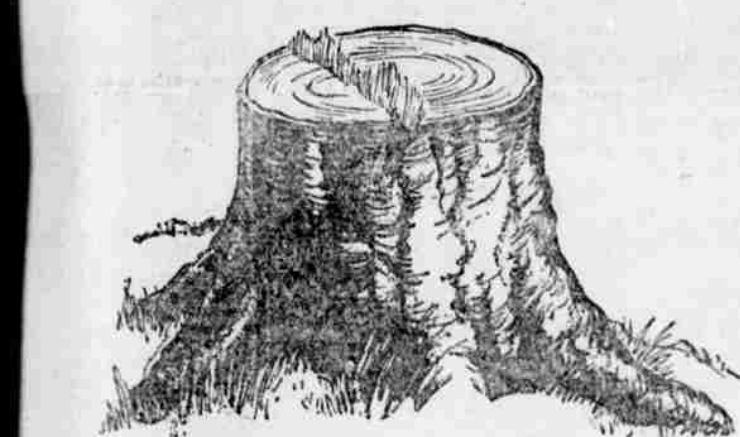
