Roland Schwartz, as Judy's father, a golf enthusiast of the 19th degree proves a wonderful old man.

Iedore Mathews, as Judy's aunt whose ideas of home life and court procedure are very amusing, does her part in an extraordinary manner.

Vivian Orentt, as Mary Carter, Judy's closest friend, handles her part with a surpassing adeptness.

Willis Moffitt and Glenn Radabaugh as Attorneys Eugene Galt and Cuthbert Heath, hold up their parts with equal brilliancy.

Clarence Searing, as Judge Benjamin Burke of Buffalo, plays his difficult role with exceptional skill.
