FARM REMINDERS

(O. A. C. Experiment Sta.)

The earliest head lettuce is that in a state of solid heading in 44 days. This crop, usually called "early", is much in demand in spring and late fall. The plants usually make fine solid heads. The setting of the young plants in the

field is usually in late February. The crop will begin to mature on about April 15.

Many successful fruit growers are constructing spray towers, on their spray rigs in order to insure better protection from pests in the upper third of trees over twelve years of age. Most of the damage done by

scab and worms has been on these unprotected parts in the past.

At this season potatoes in storage should be kept well ventilated to prevent sprouting, which the warmer weather is beginning to cause in the Willamette valley. If the potato piles are opened and the potatoes spread out, and the storage places are opened on cold nights and kept closed during the warmer period, the potatoes can be held in good seed condition for a longer period.

The cause of the mosaic diseases is a lowly protozoa, according to a report received by the botany department at O. A. C. This organism, which is the simplest form of animal life, has been found in the tissues of plants affected by the mosaic. The discovery is considered one of the most important in the field of plant pathology in recent times.

The latest report came from the Michigan agricultural experiment station, and it seems to be confirmed by the fact that men at widely different points have obtained similar results. The disease is readily recognized by a mottling of the leaf, sometimes presenting a beautiful mosaic structure, from which the name "mosaic" is taken. Affected leaves remain on the plant for a time, but eventually lose all their coloring. Curling of the leaves, resembling the curling produced by green aphids, is another symptom of the mosaic.

The most important crops attacked by the mosaic are potatoes, tomatoes, and other members of the same family. The peach yellows may be another form of the same disease. SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY PAYS TAX

First Installment of Railroad Company's Tax Amounts to Over \$94,000—Company Pays One-tenth of Total Tax

Three checks totaling \$94,012.33 have been received by the tax department, representing the first half of the taxes of the Southern Pacific railroad company for the year. The largest of the three checks was for \$58,637.31. The Southern Pacific company pays approximately one-tenth of the taxes paid in Douglas County. Its taxes amounting to almost \$100,000 annually. Last year its tax was slightly in excess of this figure but this year's payment will be lower due to a cut in the state tax.

The time for the payment of the first half of the county tax, is up today and from now on the law provides for the levying of penalty and interest in addition to the amount of the first half.

Charles Roberts, chief deputy, reports that the taxes have been received quite promptly this year.

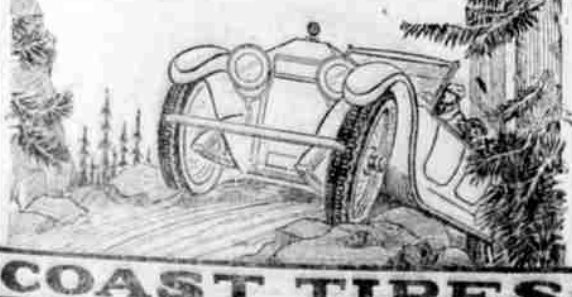
