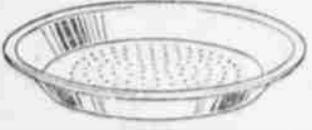

### NOTICE OF INTENTION TO IMPROVE PINE STREET

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That at a meeting of the Common Council of the City of Roseburg, Oregon, held on the 2nd day of April, 1923, the following resolution was adopted:

"RESOLVED, that the Common Council of the City of Roseburg do hereby propose to improve Pine Street from the North line of Oak street to the South line of Washington street, in the City of Roseburg, Oregon, in the following manner:

First: by grading said street to the grade of the roadway of said street thirty feet wide with reinforced concrete pavement.

Second: by paying the roadway of said street thirty feet wide with reinforced concrete pavement.

Third: by constructing sidewalks, if necessary.

Fourth: by constructing street monuments.

Fifth: by laying vitrified sewer pipe, if necessary.

Sixth: by constructing catch-basins and inlets.

Seventh: by constructing concrete curbs.
