## DR. WIRT WILL SPEAK APRIL 30

### Near East Relief Worker to Give Address at High School

## ORPHANS ARE MOVED

### Armenian Orphans Are Being Taken to Homes in Holy Land—Biblical Cities to Provide Protection

Dr. Lincoln Wirt, one of the foremost lecturers of the country, who is now associated with the Near East Relief work, will be in Roseburg the last of this week and will speak at the high school on Monday April 30. Mr. Wirt will be entertained at a luncheon by the children's committee on Saturday evening and will remain over Sunday and Monday. He is a wonderful speaker and will present a message of great interest. The meeting on Monday night will be open to the public and everyone should plan to hear his story of the work being carried on. Dr. Wirt visited Roseburg as a Chautauque lecturer during the war at which time he had a lecture of wonderful interest.

On this occasion he is taking up the story of the children's crusade to the Holy Land. In a recent letter to Near East workers in this country, Dr. Wirt says:

"The saddest page in the history of the Middle Ages is the story of the ill-fated Children's Crusade. Their ships were captured or broken by storms, while the brave little martyrs perished pitifully or were sold into slavery. None of them reached the Holy City to match their weakness and faith against the tyrants' steel."

"But another and more successful Children's Crusade is on its way today. Hundreds of Christian boys and girls are marching on Palestine. The streets of Nazareth, Betlehem, and Jerusalem will soon ring with their shouts and laughter and songs."

"Since the Smyrna massacre and the return of the Turks to political power, the Near East has considered it a part of wisdom to remove all the Armenian orphans under its care from the interior of Turkey."

"The evacuation of the orphanages in Cilicia and Southern Turkey began several weeks ago. Most of the children were conveyed overland, several hundred miles in native wagons to Aleppo and from there to Beirut by train."

Dr. Wirt tells of the removal of these children into the Holy Land and the finding of homes for them in the ancient cities of Jerusalem, Bethlehem, and Nazareth.

## TEN ARE STARVING ON SMALL ISLAND

NORTHPORT, Mich., April 19.—Exhausted and half starved, three men reached the mainland here yesterday, bearing news that nine men and women are slowly starving on Fox Island, an island from here in Lake Michigan. As a result of their story, an army airplane started from Selfridge field, Mount Clemens, today with food for the marooned party. The party went to the island last fall to cut timber. Three weeks ago no food supplies were exhausted, except some frozen potatoes. Repeated attempts to reach the mainland failed until today.

## RADIO WILL SPREAD WEATHER FORECASTS

SPOKANE, Wash., April 19.—Weather forecasts are to be distributed twice daily through a large radio plant to be established by the forestry department in its station seven miles north of Priest river, Idaho, according to an announcement by "R. B. Adams, telephone engineer" for districts No. 1 and No. 4.

"The forecasts will be received from the coast and will be broadcast morning and night," said Mr. Adams in this city recently. "They have been found valuable elsewhere in informing forest men at different points of the approach of rain, hot winds and other conditions influential in forest fire fighting."

"Radio broadcasting was tried last year on a small scale with gratifying results. In one instance, men were held from service at a fire because rain was forecast. The rain came as indicated and the fire was quenched without the aid of the crew."

"Quick results have been obtained with the use of the radio between Buffalo Hump and the Warrens, 45 miles apart. One station informed the other of a fire in four minutes. This is comparable with two days heretofore when messages have been sent over many lines and by way of Nampa and Boise."

## MESOPOTAMIA GIVES US DATES

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, April 19.—The dates eaten so largely in Europe and the United States come mostly from Mesopotamia. They mature during the summer months, and their cultivation is an important industry. Date palm trees grow on the shores of the river Chatt-el-Arab, from Paon on the Persian gulf to Kourna, an expanse of about 138,000 acres.

Dates trees must be abundantly watered, especially during the dry summer months. For this purpose cultivators dig ditches in the fields, which are supplied with water from the river.

The picking of dates generally takes place during September and October, and shipments are made from the port of Bassorah.

## CHURCH CENSORS NAMES GIVEN BULGAR CHILDREN

SOFIA, April 19.—The recent fashion of giving children fantastic names, drawn for the most part from the novels of Maeterlinck, Hansson and other writers, as well as the names of heroes of the communist revolution in Russia, has grown to such an extent that the church has forbidden priests to baptize infants with such names.

To enable priests to know which are allowed, the Bulgarian church has issued a catalogue of names. This list is placed at the disposal of priests. Baptism is obligatory in Bulgaria, and the priests are the official registrars.
