MEDFORD RADIO SET RECOVERED

Stolen Broadcasting Station Found By Officers and Three Men are Held as Suspects—Panel is Wrecked.

MEDFORD, April 21.—Emery (Buster) Tull and Paul Wright are under arrest suspected of having stolen the Virgin broadcasting set from the fair grounds last Monday night and Mr. Bowman of Central Point was held this morning by authorities for alleged complicity in the theft.

When Donald Ross of Central Point read in last night's Mail Tribune of the theft of the radio set he at once called Virginia, who notified Deputy Alden that the apparatus was in the possession of Bowman at Central Point.

Bowman, according to police reports, told a story of crating the set and sending it to Seattle as ordered to do by the two boys as they had been planning to leave for Seattle today.

This story, however, conflicts with that of the two boys who state that Bowman offered them a third-interest each if they would steal the apparatus and bring it to him, according to Deputy Sheriff Forrester.

The bakelite panel of the set upon which all the instruments were mounted was stripped bare and then smashed with an axe. The instruments were crated ready for shipment. Numerous spotlights, motors, meters, and auto accessories, stolen recently from Medford cars in front of the Elk's club and at other places were also found by the officers.

It is said that the set was on Bowman's porch and that every one in Central Point was aware Bowman had it, which tends to substantiate Bowman's story.

Tull and Wright were placed under arrest last night at the Hotel Holland where Wright was employed as bell boy. He had been working there only five or six days. Bowman was not arrested until this forenoon after the boys told their story and accused him of complicity.

MARSHFIELD, Ore., April 20.—Judge John C. Kendall today sentenced L. W. Pearce to be hanged at Salem on June 2.

Pearce, who is a Coos county rancher, was found guilty by a jury of first degree murder for killing his neighbor, J. M. Culver. He choked his wife to death the same day he shot and killed Culver, but was never tried on the wife murder charge.

Pearce is an old man and his hands shook with nervousness when he appeared before the judge, but he spoke calmly when he said he knew of no reason why sentence should not be passed. The defense has filed an appeal and will ask for a stay of execution.

CITIZENS' CAMP WILL OPEN JULY 26

Local Druggist Appointed by Legion Commander to Handle Enlistments for Interested Parties of This Vicinity.

Nathan Fullerton has been appointed by Dr. Stewart, commander of the local American Legion post, to take charge of the enlistments for the Citizens' military training camp which will be open on July 26, at Camp Lewis and Fort Warden, and will end August 21. These camps are held by the war department under the National Defense act. Eight hundred men will be received at Camp Lewis for instruction in Infantry, Field Artillery, Cavalry, Engineers and Signal Corps branches, and 50 will be sent to Fort Warden for Coast Artillery instruction.

The objects of these camps three being held yearly for each nine corps areas in the United States, are to bring together young Americans of high type from all sections of the country, thereby developing closer national and social unity; to teach the privileges, duties and responsibilities of American citizenship; to stimulate patriotism; to interest young men in the importance of military training; to teach self discipline; to learn the importance of proper physical and mental hygiene and to develop the physical standard of the American youth through participation in military exercises, athletic games and sports, conducted under expert direction.

The benefits derived by attending the camp are secured without expense to the students, as the War Department provides transportation to camp and return, board, lodging and expert medical attention, uniforms, equipment, arms, laundry, (for clothing issued at camp), and amusements in the form of athletic games and musical entertainments.

Last year nearly six hundred enthusiastic young Americans "signed in" at Camp Lewis for the Citizens' military training camp, and were found on "weighing out" to have made an average gain of 2.7 pounds per man, a good general indication of the benefits of their training during a four week period.

Four courses of instruction will be given: a half Red Course—enlistment from 17 to 24 years; an Advanced Red Course—17 to 24 years; a White Course—18 to 24 years; and a Blue Course—19 to 24 years. Applicants for the half Red Course need have no previous course at a Citizens' military training camp and no previous military training of any kind.

LANE COUNTY OIL EXPERTS SKEPTICAL

EUGENE, April 21.—Geologists of the University of Oregon, acknowledged experts in work of locating oil bearing areas, are skeptical as to the prospects for oil in Lane county. They say that in all their field trips they have found no formations in this vicinity that would lead to the belief that oil existed in paying quantities, justifying commercial activity. In an article prepared especially for The Guard they tell how a trained geologist, such as are retained by the big oil trusts, works in an effort to locate oil bearing formations. These men, they say, never use mechanical devices or other tests not recognized by the world of science. The article follows:
