WOMEN'S CLUBS TO MEET AT MEDFORD

The twenty-third annual convention of the Oregon Federation of Women's clubs will be held in Medford, May 21-24. It is expected that at least 200 delegates will be present from all parts of the state. There are in the Federation 150 clubs with an approximate membership of 10,000 women.

Mrs. Sadie Orr-Dunbar, chairman of the program committee, announces that a program of interest and information is being prepared by the department and division heads, the chairman of standing committees and that there will be in addition several speakers of note as well as many musical selections.

On the opening night of the convention, Monday, May 21 there will be a reception to delegates in the First Presbyterian church at which there will be addresses by the mayor Earl C. Gaddis; the president of the Chamber of Commerce and Mrs. E. H. Merriek, president of the Greater Medford club, the hostess organization. The response will be made by Mrs. William Bell of Roseburg, second vice president of the Federation.

The reports of officers and chairmen of standing committees will be given Tuesday morning. In the afternoon the presidents of each federated club will give a report of the achievements of their organizations during the past year. This will be followed by a tea at the home of Mrs. Frank G. Owen. The Wednesday session will be held at the new Ashland Community House. In the morning the department of public welfare of which Mrs. Sadie Orr-Dunbar is head, will have reports and speakers. This will include the Crippled Children Work report by Mrs. P. L. Campbell. The department of applied education will be reported by the chairman, Miss Grace Johnson.

In the afternoon the American Citizenship department, Miss Vella Winner, chairman, will share the hour with the department of fine arts, Mrs. Collins Ellis, chairman. Thursday morning the department of legislation of which Mrs. Alexander Thomson is chairman will be in charge of the first hour and later the department of press and publicity of which Mrs. Edith Knight is chairman, will be in charge.

Mrs. Ida B. Callahan of Corvallis, president of the Federation, will preside and will give a report of the General Federation convention now in session in Atlanta. Herbert Bede of Cottage Grove, president of the state editorial association, will be a speaker at one of the evening sessions.
