MISSOULA, Mont., May 8.—Nine Japanese may die as a result of infection of a vaccine, recently discovered which, it is believed, may set up immunity in human beings from Rocky Mountain spotted fever, caused by tick bite. The Japanese all of this city, are fellow countrymen of Dr. Hideyo Noguchi, scientist of the Rockefeller Institute, who discovered the vaccine. If they don't die, they will be asked to permit an infected tick to bite them. All the men are volunteers.

CROP PEST IN NURSERY STOCK

SALETT, May 8.—Purchasers of nursery stock are being warned by A. A. Hinkley, state commissioner of agriculture, to examine shipment received through the mails or by express in order that new pests may not be introduced into the state.

Recent shipments from nurseries outside the state have brought with them, in the packing used to keep the shipments moist and in good condition, samples of both animal and vegetable pests, which are cap-

"ORPHANS OF THE STORM" IS SENSATION

D. W. Griffith's newest photoplay sensation, "Orphans of the Storm," adapted from the stage classic made famous by Kate Claxton, "The Two Orphans," will be seen in the city at the Liberty Theatre only today and tomorrow.

The production represents months of preparation and a most careful study of the period depicted, the time of the French Revolution. The basis of the story is the famous old play, but Mr. Griffith has woven into it an historical romance with the thrills of some of the maddest days

of the revolution. The guillotine is seen at its deadly work and there are tremendous crowds of frantic men and women fighting wildly against the aristocrat in the hope of freedom.

The sword worn by the character Lafayette in D. W. Griffith's new picture, "Orphans of the Storm" at the Liberty Theatre was designed by the same firm and by a direct lineal descendant of the individual swordsmith making the original sword which was presented to Lafayette by the American Congress.

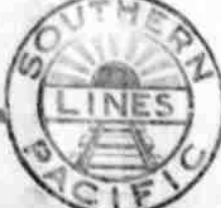
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
