NEW LAMP WILL BE GIVEN TEST

A new type of decorative lamp post and street light, was installed today at the corner of Cass and Jackson streets, in front of the I. O. O. F. building, by W. F. Burman, representing NePage and McKenny company of Seattle. Mr. Burman has been here for several days, working with the city council and light committee in the interest of his company and the style of lamp which they represent.
The new light will be 15 feet to the center of the light source, in height. It is mounted on an attractive pole, with a harp design top and a suspended globe. The refractor is what is known as the Holograph type, and is manufactured by the Holograph Glass Company. It has a double globe, the inside refractor breaking the light rays in a horizontal plane, and the outside refractor breaking them vertically.
Mr. Burman is an advocate of a higher type of mounting for street illumination. He states that the larger cities are now placing their street lights from sixteen to thirty feet high, and by so doing obtaining better illumination. His plan for Roseburg is to install only 20 posts instead of 60 as proposed, and by raising them, and installing the fixtures which his company handles, he states that he can give better illumination than by any other method.
The lamp is being connected up this afternoon by Ellis Miller, a local electrician, and it is planned to make tests with the light tonight.
