TRUSTY ESCAPES FROM STATE PEN

SALEM, May 15.—Edward Zellert, 29-year-old convict, serving a sentence of five years from Multnomah county for assault with intent to rob, is the latest to leave the penitentiary wood camp and play the little game of "out sight, unseen" with Warden Smith and his force.

Zellert, it was reported at the prison today, was formerly a soldier and served during the great war. He acquired a penchant for travel which still remains with him. Warden Smith stated today that a bunch of men is taken to the wood camp each morning and returned to the prison each evening and it is understood Zellert was one of the men going out today.

A force of men was active this morning trying to round up Zellert. Warden Smith is insistent that George and Dewey Jones did not participate in the attempted prison break of March 2, when a band of prisoners sawed their way through their cell bars, went through the roof and into the prison yard before they were apprehended.

"The families of these men are very much excited over the fact that these boys have been accused of attempting to escape. They never did and have been very good boys while at the prison," said the warden. "In justice to them their names should be removed from the list of those endeavoring to leave."
