ENGLISH JAILS OPEN FOR DELINQUENT TAXPAYERS

(By Associated Press.)
LONDON, May 17.—What happens the people in England who do not ay their income-tax, has been told an official of the Inland Revenue,

by an official of the Inland Revenue, who declares there are about 1,000 such delinquents now in jail compared with 1,162 two years ago.

Plenty of time is given by the authorities for payment, said this official, and in cases where it can be shown that funds are not available, easy methods are devised. In other cases, after a certain interval, a notice is sent to the defaulter that the tax must be remitted by a certain date—usually ten days time. If that is disceptanted a more urgent notice is sent, and three days grace given. After that a distress warrant against the defaulter's goods is obtained. Those who are imprisoned for default are senerally single, or have no seizare generally single, or have no seiz-able property of their own.
